THE Departure of her Imperial Majesty for Petersbourg, will certainly take Place in the Course of the Month of December, for which Preparations are already making. Great Quantities of Snow has lately fallen in these Parts, and the Frost is so far set in, that we begin already to make use of Sledges. The Nuptials of the Chamberlain Nariskin with Mademoiselle Romanzow, Niece of the late General Romanzow, were celebrated at Court Yesterday with great Magnificence.

Naples, Oct. 20, N. S. On the 10th Instant M. Reggio, General of the Gallies, received Notice that the King's Frigate la Reine, lately launched from the Stocks, had been obliged to take Shelter in the Port of Baja, having been in Danger of foundering, her first Tere of Guns proving too low, on which Account many Carpenters and Caulkers were immediately ordered to Baja, to repair these Faults, and to make her fit for Navigation. The Prince of Ardore, the King's Ambassadour at the French Court, is preparing to set out from this City on his Return to Paris.

Naples, Oct. 29, N. S. The King having been informed that the ill Usage of the Officers to their Soldiers, and the Badness of the Bread with which they had been served, were the principal Reasons of the late great Desertion amongst his Troops, has given Orders for the punishing of all those, who, upon Enquiry, shall appear to have been guilty of either of those Offences.

Rome, Oct. 25, N. S. Cardinal Portocarrero's first publick Audience of the Pope, as Minister from the Court of Spain, is fixed for the 28th Instant. The Bishop of Agnani is appointed Bishop of Lorette, and the Abbe Latanzi is appointed Bishop of Citta di Castello.

Florence, Oct. 31, N. S. Last Week the Dominican Fryers in this City having assembled to chuse their Prior, a Dissention ensued amongst

them, and Pere Isola was very Irregularly elected. Pere Vernaccini, Brother to the Spanish and Naples Agent in this City, who had principally opposed that Election, was, by express Orders from the Regency, ordered to depart Tuscany in twenty-four Hours: A Representation thereof having been made to the General of their Order at Rome, he, on the 21st Instant, by an Express, declared void and revoked that Election, as irregular and contrary to their Rights and Constitutions, appointing at the same time another Frier to act provisionally as Prior.

Plaisance, Nov. 1, N. S. The Infant Duke arrived here Yesterday from Parma, and was complimented thereupon by all Persons of Distinction at this Place. An Express is arrived here with an Account, that the Gallies, on board of which was the Infanta Dutchess of Parma, had been seen off Sestri di Ponente, where her Highness was to land; from thence she is to proceed by St. Peter d'Arena near Genoa for this City, where every Thing is ready for her Reception. The Infant Duke sets out To-morrow or next Day for Castle St. Giovanni, on the Frontiers of this Dutchy, to meet the Princess Infanta his Spouse, and conduct her to this Place.

Genoa, Nov. 5, N. S. The Troubles of this State seem to be at present pretty much appeased, and Commerce begins again so far to flourish, that several Ships, loaden with Merchandize from Foreign Countries, are almost continually coming in and going out of this Port. We learn by Letters from Constantinople, that an Ambassador of great Dignity was arrived there from the Sophy of Persia, with a very numerous Retinue, amongst whom were many Persons of Distinction; and that he had been admitted to an Audience of the Grand Vizier, and delivered his Credential Letters.

Milan, Nov. 6, N. S. An Express is gone to Vienna with the Proposition of the Count Arcelli, and some Jews of Mantua, for farming the

the Revenues of this Dutchy and those of Mantua, both which the Empress Queen had ordered to be farmed out.

Vienna, Nov. 8, N. S. Frequent Councils, relating to the Affairs of Hungary, have been lately held at Court, in the Presence of the Empress Queen, who advances happily in her Pregnancy. Advice has been received, that Engineer General Bohn has already made great Progress in the repairing of several of the Fortifications in Croatia. A few Days ago Count Staremhourg gave an elegant Entertainment to divers Persons of the first Rank, on Occasion of the Marriage of the young Countess of Staremhourg, his Neice, with the Baron d'Ulm; after which the new married Couple received the Nuptial Benediction, in the Presence of all the Imperial Family, in the Chapel Royal.

Munich, Nov. 9, N. S. The Elector is determined to make a further Reduction in his Troops, but at the same Time has ordered the Militia to be kept on such a Footing, as to be able at all Times to draw Men enough from thence to complete his Regiments.

Copenhagen, Nov. 12, N. S. The King has appointed M. Berregard, one of the Gentlemen of his Bed-chamber, to be his Minister to the King of Poland as Elector of Saxony. The Mortality amongst the horned Cattle is greatly decreased in Jutland, and in the Northern Parts of this Kingdom; but in the Southern Parts, in the Island of Fyonie, and even in the Neighbourhood of this City, it still continues to rage very much.

Berlin, Nov. 15, N. S. Count de Hacke, Lieutenant General of Infantry, is appointed by the King, Commandant of this City, in the Room of the late General Sydow. On the 8th Instant the Queen's Birth Day was celebrated at Court with great Magnificence. The Baron de Hopken, the new Minister from the King of Sweden to his Polish Majesty as Elector of Saxony, arrived here Yesterday from Stockholm.
