The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council,

His Majefty having been pleafed to appoint the Right Honourable George Dunk, Earl of Halifax, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Northampton, and the Right Honourable Francis, Earl Brooke, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Warwick, their Lordships this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy. This Day Lieutenant General John Huske was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn Governdt of His Majesty's Island of Jersey.

fix Ladies of the first Families were deputed  $b \neq b$ the Republick to compliment her Highness on her Arrival, and to wait on her during her Stay here. Two Days ago arrived here an armed Bark and a Xebeck belonging to this State; they have been out upon a Cruize against the Turks, and have brought in two Prizes, one of them a Tunefine, which they took near Leghorn; which fome Advices from thence fay; was under the Cannon Shot of a little Caftle, on which Account the Governor of Leghorn feized upon all the Masters and Mariners of all the Genoese Vossels that were in that Port, and intimated to the Republick's Conful, that neither the Men, nor the Veffels, flould bei fet at Liai berty till the Tunefine Vessel was restored; Ori the Receipt of this News, an extraordinary Council was held by this Government, at the } breaking up of which, three Couriers were diff patched, one to Vienna, one to Rome, and the other to Paris. It appears by the Examinations which have been taken from the Commanders and Officers of the two armed Veffels, as well as from the Masters of other Veffels which were in Sight, that the Tunifine was not within two Gun-fhot when fhe was taken; and Letters of the 14th Instant, just received from Leghorns fay, that the Regency of Florence had not approved of the Governor's Behaviour in this Af-> fair, and had ordered that the Masters and Mariners should be set at Liberty, and put in quiet. Possellion of their Vessels. Madrid, Nov. 17. Their Catholick Majefty's have fixed upon the 22d Instant for the Return of the Court to this Place, in order to pass the Winter at the Buen Retiro. This being the Anniversary of the Birth-day of the Infanta Donna Maria Antonia, who enters into the twenty-first Year of her Age, 'their Cathou lick Majesties received the usual Compliments from the Foreign Ministers and Persons of Diffinction on that Occasion. It is expected that the Marriage between this Princefs and the Duke of Savoy will be declared in a fhort Time. On the 14th Inftant M. de Carvalho, late his Portuguese Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Vienna, was prefented to their Catholick Majeffies by the Vicount de Ponte de Lima, the Portuguese Ambassador at this Court; and on the 16th M. Carvalho, with his Lady and Family, left this Place in order to return to Lisbon, where, it is faid, a very confiderable Employment will be conferred up= on him. A. Contract of Marriage is agreed upon between Don' Nicolas de Carvafal and Lancaster, Uncle to the present Duke de Linares and Alrantes, and Brother to his Catho-1/2 lick Majefty's Minister of State, Colonel of the Spanish Guards, who served in Quality of N Lieutenane

Florence, Nov. 14, N. S. On the 12th Inftant the Regency received an Express, with Dispatches from the Governor of Leghorn, to inform them, that on the 11th Inftant, a Genoese Settee and a Xebeck Cruizer, chafing two Xebeck Pirates from Tunis, an Engagement enfued in Sight of that Port, in which the Tunefines, being overpowered, endeavoured to take Shelter under the Protection of the Cannon of the Towers along the East Coaft of Leghorn, but they were closely purfued by the Genoefe, within Reach of the Cannon of the Tower of Antignano; and though the Tower fired conftantly against the Genoese, they carried off one of the Tunefine Xebecks; her Crew confifted of about 80 Men, out of which 52 escaped by swimming to shore, who were received by a Detachment of Soldiers, both Horfe and Foot, from the Garrison of Leghorn, and immediately fent to the Lazzeretto, to perform Quarantine; the reft were either killed or made Prifoners by the Genoefe. The other Xebeck made her Escape, during the Engagement, and got into the Harbour of Leghorn. In Confequence of this Irregularity on the Part of the Genoese, on the 1 rth at Night the Governor of Leghorn fent a Detachment of Grenadiers, distributed in divers Boats, to secure the Masters and Part of the Crews of all the Genoese Vessels then in the Port; the former, in Number upwards of 60, were fent to the Castle, and the latter to the common. Jails, The Rudders and Sails of the Veffels were likewise taken away to prevent their Departure, in order that a proper Satisfaction be given for the Infult committed within the Emperor's Jurifdiction. Genoa, Nov. 17, N.S. Some Days ago arrived here four French Gallies from Antibes with the Infanta of Spain, Dutchess of Parma ; on her Arrival she was faluted with 100 Cannon, and her Daughten with 4.1.
