Whitehall, January 6.

YESTERDAY Captain Hollwall arrived at the Duke of Bedford's Office, with Dispatches from Governor Grenville to his Grace, containing the Copy of a Treaty signed at Martinico the 27th of November last, between Commodore Holburn (who was deputed and authorized by the Governor of Barbadoes for that Purpose) and the Marquis de Caylus, Governor of Martinico, for the Reciprocal Evacuation of the Island of Tabago, as well as for the immediate Demolition of all the Works and Fortresses which the French have raised at Rockley Bay, or in any other Part of the said Island.

Constantinople, December 4. The Grand Signior, at the repeated Solicitations of the Regency of Algiers, has at length ordered a small Body of Troops, with 30 Pieces of Cannon, and four Mortars, to be sent to their Assistance.

Moscow, Dec. 9. On Saturday last was celebrated, in the Royal Palace of this Capital, with great Magnificence, the Anniversary of her Imperial Majesty's Accession to the Throne of Russia. At Noon her Majesty received the Compliments of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction, on this Occasion; and in the Evening she appeared in the Great Hall in a complete Uniform of the Company of Grenadiers of which she is Captain, who were there drawn up to receive her; where she permitted both the Officers and Soldiers of that Company to kiss her Hand, and they had afterwards the Honour to sup at her Majesty's Table as usual on this Day. The Grand Duke of Russia has conferred the Order of St. Anne of Holstein on Major General Orloff.

Petersbourg, Dec. 9. Several Persons of Distinction arrive here every Day from Moscow, and according to all Accounts, the Empress will be here next Monday Sevensight the 18th Instant; but the Great Chancellor M. Bestuchef is not expected before the 23d or 24th.

Rome, Dec. 20. The Pope has ordered the approaching Jubilee to be declared to the People To-morrow, by the Ringing of all the Bells in this City, which is to be continued for three Days. And on the 24th the Jubilee will begin with the Ceremony of opening the holy Gates, which will be performed with great Solemnity; for which Purpose great Preparations have been making for some Time past. Cardinal Rezzonico is arrived here from Padua, and Cardinal Spinelli, Archbishop of Naples, is expected here To-morrow, to assist at the holy Functions.

Copenhagen, Dec. 30. The Epidemical Distemper amongst the Horned Cattle, which had ceased for some Time, is lately broke out again in this Island with as much Violence as ever; and, it is said, that it equally rages in Fuhnen, Holstein, and some Parts of Jutland.

Ratisbon, Dec. 31, N. S. On the 27th Instant, the Prince of Tour Taxis, the Emperor's Principal Commissary to the General Diet of the Empire, returned hither from Vienna; on which Occasion he has received the Compliments of the several Ministers to the Diet, of the Nobility, and of many other Persons of Distinction. The 12th of next Month is fixed for the Opening of the Diet.

Paris, Jan. 2, N. S. On the 31st past the Pregnancy of the Dauphiness was declared at Court. The next Day the Sardinian Ambassador notified to this Court, by Order of the King his Master, the Conclusion of a Marriage between the Duke of Savoy, his Sardinian Majesty's eldest Son, and the Princess Dona Marie Antoinette, Infante of Spain.

Cologne, Jan. 3, N. S. Three Days ago a considerable Body of Recruits marched from hence for the Low Countries, to complete the Regiments of Lorrain, d'Arenberg, and Damnitz, who are there in Garrison; and 'tis expected they will be followed by another Body in a few Days.

Hague, Jan. 8, N. S. The Deputies from the Directors of the West India Company had Yesterday a particular Audience of his Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, and presented to him a Diploma, by which his Highness is declared Governor and Director General of that Company. The Prince of Orange has appointed the Baron de Niewkerke to be Grand Major of the Province of Groninguen, and M. Teyfinga to be Engineer of the said Province. His Highness has also appointed M. Hirzel and M. Pojanouski, to be Lieutenant Colonels in the Service of this State.
