

**Turin, Jan. 7.** The King has appointed the Abbe Rolland to be Archbishop of Tarantaise. M. de Guymont, Envoy Extraordinary from his most Christian Majesty to the Republick of Genoa, passed through this City last Week on his Return to France. A few Days ago the Court went into Mourning on Occasion of the Death of the Landgrave of Hesse Rhinfeltz, the King's Father-in-Law.

**Konigsbourg, Jan. 9.** Some Days ago Prince George Louis of Holstein Gottorp, Major General of the Prussian Cavalry, Colonel of a Regiment of Dragoons, Knight of the Order of St. Andrew of Russia, and younger Brother to the Prince Successor to the Crown of Sweden, was married to the Princess Sophia Charlotte of Holstein Beck, Widow of the late Count Alexander Emile de Dohna, who was killed at the Battle of Sorr in Bohemia.

**Dresden, Jan. 12.** The King has caused Orders to be sent to all the Officers of his Forces, to have their respective Regiments compleat by the Spring.

**Ratisbon, Jan. 15.** The General Diet of the Empire was opened here on the 12th Instant.

**Francfort, Jan. 16.** The raising a new Regiment of Dragoons, for the Service of the Imperial Court, goes on with such Success, as well in this Neighbourhood as in the Principality of Hesse Darmstadt, that it is already near compleat, and both Men and Horses make a good Appearance. We learn from Stuttgard, that the Marquess of Bareith was arrived there with a numerous Retinue, and had been received with great Affection by the Duke and Dutchess of Wirtemberg.

**Paris, Jan. 16.** On the 14th Instant the King gave Audience to several foreign Ministers, and this Morning his Majesty set out for Choisy, where it is imagined he will stay till Monday. The Duke de Richelieu is preparing to set out for Montpellier, to assist at the Opening of the States of the Province of Languedoc; and the Count de Mailly d'Aucourt is on his Departure for his Government of Perpignan.

**Hague, Jan. 22.** The States of Holland and Westfrizeland will assemble on the 28th Instant. His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange has promoted M. Ulrich Meyer, and M. Saufure, to the Rank of Lieutenant Colonels; and his Highness has also disposed of several Military Subaltern Employments. M. Calkoen is on his Departure for Dresden, in Quality of Minister Plenipotentiary from their High Mightinesses. On the 17th Instant the Prince and Princess of Orange assisted at the Marriage of Count Degenfelt with the young Countess of Nassau, one of her Royal Highness's Ladies of the Bed-chamber.
