Ana, which are the oncly places now remaining to the Spa-niates' in that County. Out Letters, from Bruffels make not as yet any mention of the march of the Dutch or Spanish Armies, but tell as, that the Prince of Oande was broken up from Charleroy and marched towards Mons; and here are in the mean time fome reports, as if his Highness intended to bekege that place; but our next Letters from those paris will bester inform us. Our advices from Maria tell us. That Montieur de Turenne is putting himself into luch a pofture, as that he may be able to oppofe the defigne of the contederate Troops in the Palatinate, who as our letters fay form to have an eye upon Philipslourg. It is fild here, that the City of strasburgh has promifed to observe the Neutrality inviolably, and not to give any passage to the Lorrain or Imperial Troops.

Antweip, Fune 12. On Sunday laft the Marquis d' Affeittar, who together with the Count de Waldeck, had been to e nfer with the General Souches at Ruremond, returned to Bruffels; and gave his Excellency an account that they had adjusted all matters relating to the Campagne; The Imperial Armycontinues in the mean time tricamped near Dutrin; but we are told, that it was refolved, that they faculd break up from, thence yefter-Hay, and take their march towards the Meufe, which they are topols at Namur, and to come and joyn with our Army.
