By Advices from Munich we learn, that the Elector of Bavaria has named the Baron de Hassang to be his Minister to this Court.

The new-born Princes, who is to be christened this Afternoon, is likewise in a very promifing State of Health. Berlin, Jan. 31. On the 27th Instant the Lord Hyndford fet out from hence for Hanover, from whence he will proceed on his Journey for London; and on the 29th the King went to Potidam, accompanied by Duke Ferdinand of Brunswick Wolfenbuttle. His Serene Highnefs the Prince of Orange affifted both Yefterday and To-Day at the Allembly of their High Mightineffes the States-General, when feveral Military Officers, who have been promoted by his Serene Highnels, took the usual Oaths for their feveral Employments.
