feifed here, to be opened; and the Money being compted, to be nailed up again, putting his own Seal, and defiring the Magiltrates likewife to put theirs on the faid Barrels. The Munfter Troops, who, we told you in our laft, were paffed the Rhine, and have fince been quartered in the Neighboring Vitages, will decamp this day, and march towards the Imperial Army. The Duke of Bournonville, and Count Portia, are parted from Bon with 3000 Horfe, 500 Foot, and fix pieces of Cannon, rowards Francfort.

Liege, June 13. The Imperial Army continues, as yet, encamped in the Neighborhood of Dueren, along the Roer: This day the Munster Troops, who make up about 6000 Men, are to joyn with the faid Army; and on Friday next they will all decamp from thence, and march towards Namur, to pass the Meuse there.

Antwerp, June Ty. On Wednefday laft his Excel-: lency the Count de Monterey, was to visit the Prince of Orange in his Quarters at Sems, and returned again late last night. The Prince of Gonde continues still with his Army near Mons, has befet all the Poils round the place, has given orders for the bringing feveral pieces of Cannon from Aeth and Tournay, and caufed infinite numbers of Faggots to be made, from whence many argue, that he intends a fiege, which our Superiors pretend they would be glad to fee, as well becaufe of the firength of the place, as of the nearnels of three Armies, to relieve ir. The Imperialilis are upon their march, and within fix or feven days, we hope, they will have passed the Meuje, and then the Dutch and our Troops will likewife march, and advance together towands the French, if they continue where they now sre. Lieutenant General Agourto is come from Grmbray to Valenciennes, and those Quarters, with 2000 Horse and Dragoons, to hinder the passage of all provisions which may be fent that way to the French-Several Bores come this morning from the parts about Mons report, that they have heatd all this morning great fhooting; of which, we do not yet know the rea-fon, for we cannot believe the Frènch will venture to besiege that place. An Agreement, as is faid, having been made with the Count de Lippe, who commanded 800 Horfe, that had been formerly in the fervice of the Elector of Cologne, to come and ferve here, the Prince of Vaudemont was accordingly fent to the Country of Liege with a moneths pay for them, and to fee them mustered; but the Soldiery understanding of the contract made by their Officers, mutined, plundered them, and all their Baggage, and then marched away in an entire Body, carrying their Colonel as a prifoner with them.

Bruffels, June 15. We are at prefent in great uncertainty concerning the defigns of the French, who continue encamped near Mons. The thirteenth inftant, from 4 in the afternoon, till 9 at night, we heard much shooting, which made us prefently believe, that the Prench had begun the fiege of that place, though at the fame time we looked upon it as a thing very improbable, that the Prince of Conde should offer to besiege a place of that firength, provided with a Garrifon of 5000 Men, and with Provisions, and all other necessaries, and that in the face of three Armies : But the next morning we received advice, That the fhooting in the Enemies Camp was occaffoned by the news they received of the Surrender of Dole to his Majefty, the feventh inftant. In the mean time, it is faid, That the Prince of Conde has fent out a party to attack a Castle not far from Mons, in which Monf. de Louvigny, this last Winter, put 200 Men to keep the paffage open between that

place and this. On Tuefday laft, the Prince de Vaudemont went to meet 3000 Cuiraffiers, who are coming hither from Germany. The nineteen h and twentieth initant, the Imperial Army purpose to pass the Meuse, at Namur, and then the Prince of Orarges Army, as likewife ours, will begin to march. His Highness hath ever fince Tuesday last had his Quarters at Sems, between Malines and Vilvoerden.

Hague, June 15. This morning was a Conference between the Heer Heuch, Extraordinary Envoy from the King of Denmark, and the Committioners of this State. Monfieur Rabenbaup is going to attend the Prince of Orange in the Army, but returns hither again. Since our laft, we have not any news from our Fleet.

Ditto. It is faid, that the Treaty with the King of Denmark is on the point of being concluded, if not concluded already. From Bruffels they write, That the Count de Monserey has at laft refolved to remain at Bruffels, during the Campagne, and to leave the command of his Army to the Marquefs d'Affentar. The French fortifie Grave with all poffible diligence, having 2000 Men continually at work, and the rather, becaufe they apprehend being attacked: It is faid a Body of 14 or 15000 Men are bringing together is their Neighborhood, to be commanded by Monfieur Rabentani,

Paris, June 16. Our Letters from the Camp highly commend the brave refiftance which was made by the befieged in Dole, who, as we have already told you, were forced to Surrender the feventh inftant, the command of which place the King ha given to the Sieur d'Espagne, Commissary General of the Army. The firth initant, the Queen and the Dauphin came from Dijon, to the Caffle of Athley, two leagues from Dole, and the next day came into the Kings Camp : At prefent his Majefty has his Quarters at a place called 1 ore; three leagues beyond Dole, having fent the Duke de la Feuillade Liquitenant General, and the Marquefs de Kenel, and the Marquels de Villeroy, Marefchals de Camp, to befiege Salins; and the Marquels de Rochefort is marched with fifteen Troops of Horfe, and three Bataillonso Foot, towards Lorraine. The Duke of Luxemburgh is arrived here, and goes to the Prince of Condes Army in + landers. The twentieth inflant, the King intends, as we are told, to part from Lore, to be the 25 at Rheims, and from thence his Majeitie will go into Picardy, to be near the Frontiers. The fourteenth inftant, the Duke of Orleans arrived at S. Clon, where he purpofes to itay thirteen or fourteen days, and then to return to the Court.
