

Navy Office, Feb. 21, 1749:

The Right Hon. the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying of Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 31st of December 1748, to the 30th of June 1749, according to his Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf;

These are to give Notice, that the said Payment will begin to be made at the Treasurer of the Navy's Office in Broad Street, at Eight of the Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, to wit, on Tuesday the 13th of next Month for Captains. Wednesday the 14th ditto for Lieutenants.

Thursday the 15th ditto for Masters and Surgeons. That all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any publick Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid the said Half Pay, but also produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths required by Act of Parliament to his present Majesty. And in Case any of the said Sea Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.
