IS Majefty came this Day to the Houfe of Peers, and being in his Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, the Honourable Sir Henry Bellenden, Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to,

An Act for continuing and granting to bis Majesty certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Oyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty. An Act for repealing the Duties now payable upon China Raw Silk, and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof. An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters. An Act to render Prosecutions for Perjury, and Subornation of Perjury, more easy and effectual. An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers, granted and continued by Two Acts of Parliament, for amending the Highways leading from Brampton Bridge to Welford Bridge in the County of Northampton, and the great Post Road from Morter-Pitt-Hill to Chain Bridge, leading into Market Harborough in the County of Leicester, and for explaining and making more effecjual the faid Acts; and also for repairing the Roads leading from Morter-Pitt-Hill and Brampton Bridge to the Town of Northampton.

The famous Rabin; who has been confined for fome Time paft in this City, having been convicted of feducing feveral Country People to embrace the Jewish Religion, was this Morning fentenced by his Judges to be burnt alive. Dresden, March 12. M. Petzold, our late Refident at the Court of Russia, is appointed to go in the fame Quality to that of Vienna, in the room of M. Lautenfach, who has obtained his Recall. We are assured that the King has changed his Sentiments with regard to the Journey he proposed taking to Leipzick, and that he will certainly fet out for Poland immediately after Eafter; which makes it believed; that the Affairs of that Kingdom require his Majeity's Prefence rather more than was at first imagined; and 'tis now laid, that the Affair of the State Prifoners will be decided before his Departure. An Edict has been published here, within these few Days past, by which all the Taxes of this Electorate are to be farmed out for a certain Number of Years to the highest Bidders. We learn from Dantzick, that the Bishop of Warmie was arrived there, in order to adjust the Differences which have fublisted for fome Time paft between the Magistrates and Inhabitants of that City.
