That the Tenures of all Grants of Land what soever already made to any Persons within the Province of Georgia be enlarg'd and extended to an absolute Inheritance; and that all future Grants of Land shall be of an absolute Inheritance to the Grantees, their Heirs and Assign'd by Order of the Trustees.
