By the Lords Juffices, A D E C L A R A T I O N, Appointing the Diffribution of Prizes taken from the Genoeze.

Dorfet, P. Marlborough, Argyll, Bedford. THEREAS His Majesty's Ships of War did, between the First Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and forty five, New Style, and the chtire Ceffation of Hostilities, by virtue of the late Treaty of Aix la Chapelle, seize and take feveral Ships, Veffels, and Goods belong-Ing to the Subjects of the Most Serene Republick of Genoa, the Property whereof, upon their being condemned as lawful Prize, belongs to his Majesty: And whereas the Genoeze did, within the Time aforefaid, take, and feize in the Port of Genoa, on Board a Tartan called the St. Catherine of Padua, Pedro Raffetti Mafter, divers Bales of Silk, the Property of fevefal Merchants his Majesty's Subjects trading to Italy, to the Amount or Value of Six thoufand fix hundred eighty two Pounds, four Shillings and eleven Pence, the Prime Cost thereof (that is to fay) one Bale belonging to Anthony Noguier, Value One hundred and fixty four Pounds, ten Shillings and five Pence; two Bales belonging to Richard Morhall and Company, Value Three hundred twenty feven Pounds, fifteen Shillings and one Penny; two Bales belonging to William Selwin and Company, Value Three hundred fifty three Pounds, eleven Shillings and eleven Pence; two Bales belonging to Peter Nouaille, and James Frushatd, Value Three hundred twenty one Pounds, ten Shillings and four Pence; one Bale belonging to John Delamare and Company, Value One hundred and feventy three Pounds; one Bale belonging to Mary Magdalene Alavoine, Value One hundred seventy two Pounds, twelve Shillings; two Bales belonging to Henry Lonbier, Value Three hundred and feventy one. Pounds; eight Bales belonging to John Blaquiere, Value One thousand three hundred seventy seven Pounds, nineteen Shillings and three Pence; five Bales belonging to William Sheldon, Value Eight hundred and feven Pounds two Shillings; four Bales belonging to Roger Hogg, Value Seven hundred thirty nine Pounds, eighteen Shillings and four Pence; three Bales belonging to Noah Titner, Value Five hundred thirty two Pounds, fourteen Shillings and eleven Pence; three Bales belonging to Joseph Poinhan, Value Five hundred and twenty Pounds; three Bales belonging to John Logier Lamotte and Company, Value Four hundred eighty five Pounds, fourteen Shillings and ten Pence; and two Bales belonging to William Wigget, Value Three hundred thirty four Pounds, fisteen Shillings and ten-Pence; and afterwards proceeded to Condemnation thereof: And whereas a Commission did issue, by virtue of his Majeity's Order in Council, published in the Gazette of the Thirteenth of February, One thousand feven hundred and forty leven, to Impower his Majefty's Courts of Admiralty to, try and condemn' the feveral Ships, Veffels, and

Goods, belonging to the Genoeze, which had been, or should be taken by his Majesty's Ships of War, as the Ships and Effects of his Ma+ jefty's Enemies; and feveral of fuch Ships and Effects fo taken have been condemned as lawful Prize; but several Appeals have, by, or by the Orders of Signior Gastaldi, Minister of the Most Serene Republick of Genoa, being interposed to the Lords Commissioners of Appeals in Prize Caules from those Sentences: And whereas a Petition has been prefented to his Majesty in Behalf of the Officers and Seamen concerned in the taking of the faid Prizes from the Genoeze, fetting forth, That from his Majefty's known Generofity and Bounty they had Reason to hope, that his Majesty would be graciously pleased to give up his Right in such Prizes as had or might be thereafter condemned, in their Favour; in Confidence whereof they had come to an Agreement with Signior Gastaldi, Minister of the Most Serene Republick of Genoa, acting in Behalf of the Genoeze Subjects, to take Place in cafe his Majesty should be gracioufly inclined to give his Royal Affent thereto, and which they prayed his Majesty would be pleafed to do: And whereas a Memorial has been also presented by the faid Signior Gastaldi, Minister of the faid Republick of Genoa, setting forth, That for avoiding the great Expence of Law Suits, and other Caufes, he did, on the Twentieth Day of September last, conclude such Agreement with the British Captors, in regard to the Prizes made upon the Genoeze Subjects, or Inhabitants of the State of Genoa, and hoping his Majefty would vouchfafe to give his Royal Affent to the faid Agreement, and put thereby a perpetual Silence to future Disputes: And whereas a Petition has been also presented in Behalf of the faid Merchants his Majesty's Subjects trading to Italy, fetting forth their aforefaid Lofs, and praying, That his Majesty would be gracioufly pleafed to order, That, before any Distribution be made of the Produce of the faid Ships and Effects that had been taken from the Genoeze, they should be reimbursed thereout the Amount of their faid Effects, that had been fo feized and condemned by the Genoeze; We having taken the Premiss into our Consideration, do, by and with the Advice of his Majesty's Privy Council, hereby publish and declire, That the net Produce, arising from the Sale or Difpofal of all the Ships, Veffels, Goods, Monies, Wares, Merchandizes and Effects, belonging to the Genoeze, which have been feized and taken by his Majefty's Ships of War, between the faid First Day of May, One thousand feven hundred and forty five, New Style, and the Time of the Ceffation of Hoftilities as aforefaid, either upon Genoeze, or Neutral Bottoms, and which have been, or fhall be condemned (and have not by the Sentence of any of his Majefty's Courts of Admiralty, or Vice Admiralty, or otherwife, been already reftored to the Genoeze) upon Signior Gastaldi's withdrawing or releasing, or causing to be withdrawn or released, all Appeals interposed before the Lords Commissioners of Appeals, from any Sentence's condemning any
