Naples, July 8.

ON the 2d Instant arrived here a Tartane from Trapani, the Master of which reports, that the Corsairs of Barbary had lately taken, in the Sicilian Seas, two Neapolitan Tartanes, loaden with Materials for the new Fortifications of Girgenti; but that two Galliot of Trapani having given them Chase, had not only obliged them to abandon their Prizes after a smart Engagement, but had also taken one of those Corsairs, on board of which was 129 Men, who had been made Slaves.

Genoa, July 11. Most of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, who went to Turin to partake of the Entertainments and Diversions which were given there by his Sardinian Majesty on Occasion of the Marriage of the Duke of Savoy with the Infanta of Spain, are returned, greatly pleased with their Reception at that Court. The Bark and Chebeck which the Company of our Lady of Succours had sent out to cruize against the Corsairs of Barbary, are come back into Port, without having been able to take any of those Corsairs; and 'tis thought they will be replaced by two Galliot, as they are more proper Vessels for cruizing in the Summer Season, when the Weather is usually calm.

Stockholm, July 17. By Advices from Finland we learn, that three of our Frigates, and the like Number of Gallies, had put to Sea from Carelsroon, in order to cruize along the Coast, and exercise the Seamen. We learn also from thence, that the Squadrons of Russian Men of War and Frigates from the Ports of Cronstadt and Revel, had joined off the latter Port.

Warsaw, July 17. The Marriage of Count Mniszeck, Grand Marshal of the Court, with Mademoiselle de Bruhl, was celebrated on Saturday last with great Magnificence. The Polish Nobility, and the Deputies from the several Palatinates, arrive here almost daily, in order to assist at the approaching extraordinary Diet.

Prague, July 18. The Small-Pox rages very much at present in this City, and carries off great Numbers of Persons, particularly Children. The last Letters from Vienna inform us, that their Imperial Majesties have fixed on the 16th

of next Month for their Departure for this Kingdom, in order to view the different Camps which are forming here. The same Letters brought Orders for the Regiments of the Archduke Charles, and those of Harfch and Haller, which are all in Garrison here, to march on the 30th Instant to the Camp of Leschowitz.

Versailles, July 23. On the 18th Instant the Queen arrived here from Compeigne, as did Yesterday the King, accompanied by the Mesdames de France. The Regiment of Grenadiers of France, which was reviewed by his Majesty at Compeigne, marched from thence on the 17th for Arras, where it is ordered into Garrison.

Hanover, July 24. Yesterday in the Afternoon the King came from Herenhausen to this City, and viewed the new Apartments of the Castle; the Princess of Hesse arrived soon after, and accompanied his Majesty to the Opera House, from whence they returned about Two o'Clock this Morning to Herenhausen. M. Hop, Envoy Extraordinary from the States General of the United Provinces, is arrived here from the Hague, and will go To-morrow to Herenhausen to wait on his Majesty.

Hambourg, July 25. The new Minister from the Court of France, M. Champeau, arrived here the 19th Instant, but intends to pass a few Days at a Garden House near the Town, (belonging to the French Banker Hifs) till he can put himself into some Readiness to deliver his Credentials to the City of Hambourg. The Dutchess of Holstein, (Mother to the Prince Successor in Sweden) has just received an Express from Stockholm, with News of the Princess Royal's being happily brought to Bed of a Prince, who has already received the Name of Frederick. Count Bark, who has been dispatched with this agreeable News, is to proceed immediately to Berlin.

Hague, July 31. A solemn Deputation from the States of Groninguen delivered, three Days ago, to the Prince Stadtholder, the Diploma by which the Hereditary Stadtholdership of their Province is settled on his Serene Highness and his Heirs Male and Female. It is assured that the Prince intends to set out for Loo, with her Royal Highness the Princess Royal, and the young Prince and Princess, about the Beginning of next Week, unless the excessive Heats, which
