Petersbourg, July 28.

HER Imperial Majesty has conferred the Title of Field Marshal on Count de Rasoumofsky, who was some Time since appointed Atteman or General of the Cossacks. 'Tis said an Ordonance will speedily be published, forbidding all Persons whatsoever who are employed by this Court in Posts out of the Kingdom, to place their Children in the Service of any Foreign Power, without her Imperial Majesty's express Permission.

Stockholm, Aug. 7. The Princess Royal and the new born Prince are extremely well, and her Royal Highness already receives Company daily in her Apartments. They write from Carlscroon, that the King's Vessels which are in that Road, have received no Orders to put to Sea.

Dantzick, Aug. 7. The Deputies of the Magistrates, who went from hence to Warsaw, and returned lately from thence to this City, have already laid before the Senate an Account of the Methods taken by the King for adjusting the Differences between the Magistrates and Citizens; in Consequence of which, Messieurs Janson and Richter, together with Messieurs Wernick and Eichstadt, have been already chosen Counsellors and Magistrates of this City; and this Day they all took the usual Oaths for their Employments, so that 'tis now greatly hoped that all Things will be amicably adjusted, even without his Majesty's Presence.

Vienna, Aug. 8. The Prince of Campo Reale, Ambassador from the King of the Two Sicilies, arrived here on the 2d Instant; and Yesterday the Count de Goes set out for Berlin, from whence he goes to Stockholm, in Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from their Imperial Majesties to the Court of Sweden.

Hambourg, Aug. 8. On the 28th of last Month, about Eight in the Morning, a Fire broke out in the Castle of Dorenbourg, the usual Residence of the Princess Dowager and Regent of Anhalt Zerbst, which burnt with so much Violence, that it had almost reduced to Ashes that sumptuous Building, together with most of the rich Furniture, and all the valuable Sett of Tapistry which the Empress of Russia had made a Present of to that Princess, which makes the Loss very considerable.

Hambourg, Aug. 12. Upward of 164 Barrels of British Herrings are just arrived. The Cargo is not yet come up to Town, but according to the Samples, they are perfect in Quality, and are agreed to be sold for 122 Rixdollars, or 24 l. 8 s. the Last, which, at this Season, is held a pretty good Price.

Dresden, Aug. 9. By Letters from Warsaw of the 3d Instant, all Things were ready for the Opening of the Extraordinary Dyet; the same Letters say, that their Majesties have laid aside their intended Journey to Dantzick, so that the whole Court is expected here by the End of the Month. We learn from Lusatia, that an extraordinary Quantity of Locusts had

appeared in divers Places of that Province, and had done an infinite deal of Damage.

Berlin, Aug. 11. The King has appointed the Baron de Vofs, his Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Court of Dresden, to go in the same Quality to the Court of Vienna, to relieve Count de Podewils, who has desired his Recall.

Copenhagen, Aug. 11. General Numfen is appointed to succeed the late General Scholten, in the Post of Commandant of this City. The King of Denmark continues in perfect Health at Friedensburg. Another of the Engineers Assistants, at the late Tryal of the new Cannon for quick Firing, is dead, and the Third so much hurt, that 'tis thought he can hardly recover.

Franckfort, Aug. 13. We learn from Cassel, that the Baron de Degenfeld, Counsellor to the King of Sweden, as Landgrave of Hesse Cassel; Lieutenant General of Horse, and Commissary General of War, died there on the 27th past, of an Apoplectick Fit, in the 63d Year of his Age.

Nuremberg, Aug. 13. Duke Charles of Lorraine passed through this Town Yesterday in the Evening, in his Way to the Netherlands. The Margrave and Margravine of Bareith set out lately for Poitzdam, to pay a Visit to his Prussian Majesty, from whence they are expected to return to Bareith in the Course of three Weeks.

Brussels, Aug. 14. General Luchesi set out from hence on the 9th Instant for Luxembourg, in order to meet Prince Charles of Lorraine, who left Vienna on the 3d of this Month, on his Way hither; and the Marquess de Botta Adorno will set out To-morrow in order to meet likewise his Serene Highness.

Hague, Aug. 18. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland are summoned for the 26th Instant. They write from Narden, that the Baron de Rheede, Lord of Outhoorn, Lieutenant General of Infantry, and Commandant of that Place, died there in the Night between the 13th and 14th Instant; and from Maestricht we learn, that M. Scharowitz, Lieutenant General of Infantry, and Colonel Commandant of the Regiment of Cronstrom, died there some Days ago, in the 92d Year of his Age. We learn from Warsaw, that the King of Poland has named M. Cauderbach for his Resident at this Court.

The King has been pleased to order a Conge d'Elire to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Durham, for electing a Bishop of that See, the same being now void by the Death of Doctor Edward Chandler, late Bishop thereof; and also to order a Letter, recommending to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God, Doctor Joseph Butler, now Bishop of Bristol, to be by them chosen Bishop of the said See of Durham.

The King has been pleased to present Charles Bean to the Vicarage of St. Mary in the Town of Warwick and Diocese of Worcester, the same being now void by the Death of the last Incumbent.
