Naples, August 4.

THE King proposes to set out Tomorrow for the Island of Procida, in order to spend some Days in hunting of Pheasants, of which there are a great Number in that Island. On the 28th past they began to dig, in order to lay the Foundation of a new Wing which the King has resolved to have added to the Royal Palace. The Workmen employed on this Occasion found in digging some Pots of Silver, which they concealed; but the Affair having been discovered, the Workmen were immediately taken up and sent to Prison, since which they have produced three Pots, which have been taken from them and presented to the King.

Genoa, Aug. 10. The Republick having resolved to repair the Fortifications of Gavi, which were greatly damaged during the late War, some Engineers are already set out from hence for that Purpose.

Leghorn, Aug. 10. The Ambassador whom the Regency of Tripoly sent some Time ago to their Imperial Majesties, is expected here this Evening or To-morrow, and after resting two Days, is to embark on board a Felucca which lies ready in this Port to carry him to his own Country. Last Week came into this Port a French Felucca directly from Algiers, the Master of which reports, that on the 20th of last Month, the Day he left Algiers, no less than Eleven armed Vessels put to Sea, in order to cruize in the Spanish and Italian Seas, and that several others were preparing to follow them. The same Master likewise reports, that a contagious Distemper raged with great Violence on the Coast of Africa, insomuch that from the 7th of June to the 18th of July, six Thousand Persons of all Ages had died of it at Tangiers.

Pofnania, Aug. 11. By Advices from Novogrodeck of the 2d Instant, we are informed, that a prodigious Quantity of Locusts had appeared in the Neighbourhood of that City, which in less than four Days Time had entirely devoured all the Fruits of the Earth, and even the Leaves off the Trees; and having nothing more to subsist on, they went off in two Flights, one towards Woynitz, and the other towards Ynow-

ladislaw. The same Advices add, that on the 7th of last Month there happened a very sharp Action between a Body of Light-Horse belonging to the Crown Army, and a considerable Party of Heyducks, in which several were killed and wounded, but that at last the Heyducks had been entirely routed, and obliged to retire to the Mountains with the Loss of all their Plunder, and one of their principal Leaders, who was taken Prisoner.

Modena, Aug. 12. On Thursday last the Duke our Sovereign, accompanied by the Hereditary Prince, went to view the new Road which is making from hence to Massa, and seemed greatly pleased, not only with the Beauty and Solidity of it, but also with the Diligence that is used in carrying it on; and the rather, as this Road will very much contribute to facilitate the Commerce of this Country with that of Massa. The Chevalier Cappello, the late Ambassador from the Republick of Venice to the Court of Rome, arrived here with his Lady and Family on Wednesday last, and proposes to proceed on his Journey for Venice on Sunday next.

Warsaw, Aug. 12. Sir Charles Hanbury Williams, his Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Court of Berlin, arrived here on the 7th Instant, and the next Day had his first private Audience of his Polish Majesty. On the 9th, the Deputies from the Palatinate of Kiow were also admitted to an Audience of the King, and presented a Memorial to his Majesty, setting forth the great Damages which their Province has sustained for some Months past, by the frequent Incurfions of the Heyducks. They were received very graciously; and the Crown General assured them, in his Majesty's Name, that all proper Measures should be immediately taken so to cover their Country with Light Horse, as to prevent the like Incurfions for the Future. The extraordinary Dyet, which opened on the 4th Instant, still continue their Assembly, but the Debates have run so high, that they have not as yet been able to chuse a Marshal.

Vienna, Aug. 15. The Prince of Campo Reale, Ambassador from the King of the Two Sicilies, had his first private Audience of the Emperor
