Lisbon, August 18.

ON the 13th Instant his Portuguese Majesty appointed the Marquesses Alegrete and Angeja; the Counts Cantahede, Unham, and Sabugoza; Baron Oriola; General Teles; and the Viscount Cerveira, to be Lords of his Majesty's Bed-Chamber. The same Day the Counts de St. Laurencço and Tavora were appointed Gentlemen of the Bed-Chamber to the Infant Don Pedro, his Majesty's Brother; and the next Day his Majesty named the Countesses Pombeyro, and Prado, and Mademoiselle Hercuana, to be Ladies of the Bed-Chamber to the Queen.

Naples, Aug. 25. An illicit Trade having been carried on for some Time past on the Side of Calabria, the King has ordered two armed Gallies to be stationed there, in order to put a Stop to the same, and prevent its being carried on for the Future. It having been represented to his Majesty, that the City of Barletta, upon the Adriatick Sea, was very commodiously situated for the Advantage of Commerce and Navigation, and that the Port belonging to that City might be so contrived, as that Ships of Burthen might ride there in Safety in tempestuous Weather, Orders have been given for repairing and enlarging the same, so as to make it one of the most commodious Ports in Italy; for which Purpose great Quantities of Materials of all Sorts, necessary for that Work, several Workmen, and a great Number of Gally Slaves, have already been put on Board two Xebecs, named the St. Anthony and St. Januarius; which two Xebecs are almost ready to put to Sea for Barletta. The Banditti, which for a long Time infested several of the Provinces of this Kingdom, have at length disappeared, at least we hear no more of any Robberies committed by them, which, 'tis imagined, is chiefly owing to the good Conduct of Counsellor Scaffa the Criminal Judge, who has caused several of them to be put to Death, and others to be committed to Prison. The Barbary Corsairs have also left our Coast, and 'tis not doubted but that if the other Powers of Italy would second the Efforts of this Court against those Pirates, they would very soon be obliged to keep in their own Ports. On the 19th Instant his Majesty went to the Island of Procide to take the Diversion of Hunting of Pheasants, and returned the same Evening to his Palace in this City, where all the Royal Family continue to enjoy a good State of Health. A few Days ago died the Duke de Bonnetto, at his Country Seat, of an Apoplectick Fit. On Tuesday last a Woman was executed here, having been convicted of poisoning her Husband and her two Children.

Leghorn, Aug. 28. Advice has been received here, that the Emperor's three Ships of War, which sailed from this Port on the 18th Instant,

have doubled the Cape of Panaro on the Side of Sicily, which confirms us in Opinion, that those Ships are bound first for Trieste, and then for Constantinople.

Parma, Aug. 28. The Pregnancy of her Highness the Princess, Spouse to the Prince our Sovereign, was declared at Colorno on the 25th Instant, being St. Louis's Day, which Name her Highness bears: On this Occasion the Court was very numerous and extremely brilliant; and at Night several Fireworks were played off, and a general Discharge was made of the Cannon upon our Ramparts: As her Highness designs Lying in here, the Ducal Palace is ordered to be got ready for that Purpose against the Month of December next. This Court is gone into Mourning for the Death of the late King of Portugal.

Barcelona, Aug. 28. Advice having been received some Days ago, that six Corsairs of Barbary were cruizing off our Coasts, in order to intercept two Register Ships which were expected Home from the West Indies; the Governor of this Place immediately gave Orders for four Frigates and three small Vessels to go out in Quest of them, who coming up with them the next Day, a smart Engagement ensued, in which two of the Corsairs were sunk, and the rest drove off the Coast, since which we have heard no more of them. A contagious Distemper continuing to rage on the African Coast, and particularly at Fez, the Court has sent Orders to Ceuta not to suffer any Ships to come into that Port from thence, without performing Quarantine.

Petersbourg, Aug. 28. Last Night the Empress, accompanied by the Principal Lords and Ladies of the Court, supped with Count Rasumofski, the new Atteman or General of the Cossacks, who had made great Preparations at his Palace for her Imperial Majesty's Reception. All the Palace and Gardens were beautifully illuminated; and after Supper there was a grand Ball, which lasted till Break of Day, when the Empress took her Leave, greatly pleased with her Reception.

Stockholm, Sept. 3. The King still continues his Residence at Carlsberg, from whence his Majesty often comes to this City, to assist at the Deliberations of the Senate. According to our last Advices from Finland, every Thing there remains in perfect Tranquillity.

Vienna, Sept. 5. Field Marshal Bathiani and the Generals Daun and Philibert, who commanded the Troops encamped at Colin, are arrived here; and his Imperial Majesty is expected at Schonbrunn, from Bohemia in about ten Days. Yesterday a grand Council was held at Court in the Presence of her Imperial Majesty, at the breaking up of which several Expresses were dispatched to Foreign Courts.
