## Plimouth, June 26.

N Wedneiday last arrived a Vesset at Toplane, the Master, who the leventeenth instant has been on board the Dutch Admiral off of Bette Isle, reports. That that day the Dusch had landed their Forces there, and that he heard great shooting ; but that halfning away, he cannot tell whether the Hand be taken, or not. The Master farther reports, that de Ruyter; with part of the Flee was gone towards Bayonne's to allist, by Sea, the Spiniands, who by Land are to make an attempt upon that place.

Lime, June ay. By a Vellel arrived from France, we have advice, That the Dutch Fleet laybefore Belle Isle, and that it was believed they would be fuddenly Matters of that Island: That part of the Fleet was going towards the Streights, to meet with the French Men of War that are there.

Waymouth, June 28. The twenty fixth inflant; arrived here, a fmall Veffel from Nanies; the Malter reports. That at his coming from thence, which was nine cays fince, they had news there, that the Duich had landed 1 good Men on Belle life, and that they had made themfelves Mafters of it; but the reft of the Ships com. panys not agreeing in the fame flory, we do not know what credic to give to it.

Darimouth, June 28. Just now arives here a Veffel. from S. Naloes, the Matter whereof reports, That they had this day fevennight news there, shat the Durch had landed upon Belle ille; but that they had not, as then, eaken the Cattle that is upon it.

Genaus, fune 20 The thirtcench inflant arrived here the Richmond Frigat from Ilicant, and the next day the Nonfuch; about the latter end of the week they will both fail again for Legborne. The Count Petting, late 'Ambatiador from the Emperor at the Court of Spain is arrived here, on his way homeward. The Prince of Ligne, late Vicetoy of Sicily, who is to fucced the Duke d'Offuna. in the Government of Milan, is now paffing by with ten Gallies for Final; four Gallies are gone out from hence with feveral perfons of quality to campliment him; and in the name of the Senate, to invite him hither: But there being fome difference about faluting, we may be confident he will not accept of it.

Danigick, June 23. Our Letters from Warfar tell us, That there feems at prefent a great Union amongst the Nobility, and a general inclination to profecture the War with vigor against the Turks; which the great real and application of their King, wery much encourages them to, and makes them promise themfelves a happy success: For his Majesty laying alide all other concerns, lets it be his whole business to promote the preparations that are making to bring an Atmy into the Field; that may be able to make head against the Turks: And it is faid, That his Majesty will be ready in fifteen days to go into the Field. In the mean time the Bishop of Marfe. Mes, Extraordinary Ambassador, from the most Gurl-

Itian King has promised, That he will omit no endeavors, on his part, that the Mediation of the King bis Master, with the Grand Signior, may prove effectual in procuring an honorable and lasting Peace for this Crown. We are told, that his Majelly taking notice that time perfons of guality were diffatisfied that he did not dispose of the command of Crown General, he told them, That he hoped they would not take it ill, that he defired to be their General himself, during this Campagne,

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Vinice, June 23. On Tuesday laft we received advice by a Vessel lene on purpose, by the General Cinrawis, from Zara, That the Turks had at present ten Gallies and Galliots abroad, which did very much diffurb the Navigation of the Golf; upon which, the Senate immediately resolved to fend a reinforcement of four Galleys to the Caprain of the Golf. Yesterday the Popes Nuncio had audience of the Senate, co whom he represented the great damages that the Ecclestatical Territories fullain from the Turkish and other. Cogfairs, and the obligation of the Senate to feure them from the fail depredations; that otherwise his Holings would be obliged to fit out leveral Gallies to provide for the fecurity of those Coafis, which this State will not allow of. The last week arrived here the Duke of Mantous, incegnite from Padue, and this week is returned thicher again.

Vienna, June 24. To motrow their Imperial Ma-Jeffies will part hence for Newftadt, with intention to continue there till the feventcenth of the next Moneth, His Majefty has been pleafed so confer the Char, e of Lieutenant General de Mareschal de Camp of his Army, under the command of Count Souches, upon Prince Febn Adolfus of holftein Ploen; and in a day or two he will begin his journey towards the faid Army, in order to take poficilion of this Command. The Empetor has given Commillions to the Sieur Schutz, and to the Sieur Kaining, to raife each of them a Regiment of Horfe, and to the Baron de Soye, and to the Count We are d'Attemps, to raife each a Regiment of Foot. told, that the Bishop of Munster has assured the Emperor, that he will fend 9000 Men to joyn with his Army. The Prince of Furftemberg is removed to Prffendorf, two leagues from Newfladt, where he was before.

Cologne, July 3. The Troops of the Bifhop of Munfler, which patted the Rhine here on Wednefday laft, continue flill in their Quarters about this City. Jult now arrive two thousand Munfter Troops more, being a Regiment of Horfe, and another of Dragoons, they are patting the Rhine in order to jeyn with the others.
