Madrid, Nov. 23. Her Catholick Majesty being indisposed with a Cold, was obliged to keep her Bed on the 22d Instant; but being much better To-day, it is imagined she will appear in Publick To-morrow on Occasion of the Birth-day of her Neapolitan Majesty. Count Staremberg arrived here on the 19th in his Way to Lisbon, being charged with a Compliment on the Part of their Imperial Majesties to the King of Portugal, upon his Accession to the Crown.

Lisbon, Nov. 24. We learn from Oporto, that on the 14th Instant, Seven English Mariners belonging to his Majesty's Sloop the Shoreham's Prize, Capt. Brown, who had been detained near four Years in Prison, for having fired upon a Portuguese Boat in the River of Oporto, and killed one of the Men on Board of her, were that Day set at Liberty in Consequence of his Portuguese Majesty's final Orders for that Purpose. The necessary Orders are preparing for the Evacuation of Nova Colonia, and fixing the Pillars to be erected on the Boundaries agreed on by the Treaty of the 13th of January last, between this Court and that of Spain. Count Staremberg is expected here in a very few Days from Vienna, in order to compliment the new King, in the Name of their Imperial Majesties, on his Accession to the Throne.
