Coblents, July 12. Our letters from the Palatinate tell us, that Moeficur de Turenne having advanced with his Army into the Fergfiraffe (which is the great way from Hydelbergh to Fran fort) and taken Winfheim; upon advice that the Confederate Army had paffed the Main at Francfot he returned with his Troops to Ladenburgh on the Neckar, and encamped there. That he had font feveral Ingeniers to obferve the Fortifications of Fydelbergh, which makes it thought that he has intentions to befiege it; In the mean time his Troops have pillaged and burnt feveral Villages in the Pala izate, being fole Mafters of the Field. From Francfort they write that the Confederate Troops continue encamped between that City and Hoebft, in expectation of the promifed fuccors, but that in the intrim the Souldiers are very unruly and give the Countrey people in thofe parts great diffurbance.

Our letters from Cologne tell us, that the Courier which their Elector had lately fent to Vienna with difpatches relating to the treaty of accomodation between the Emperor and his Electoral Highnes, was returned, with advice, that his Imperial Majefty had ratified the faid Treaty on these conditions, I. That his Electoral Highness fhould femove out of his Councel three proposed by his imperial majefty, his Electoral Highness thould make choice of one to be his first minister of flate, in the room of the Bishop of Sirasburg. 3. That his Imperial Majefty will not withdraw his Forces out of Bon, during the Warr; But to these conditions his Electoral Highness does not confent, and therefore has fent the Courier to Vienna the fecond time. On Tuefday last 600 Foot of the Regiment of Scarrenberg arrived at Colagse, they came from the Mcu^e, and having men, his Excellency continues there, and shefe For-
