

Dublin, January 21.

Yesterday being the Birth-day of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Great Guns were fired in his Majesty's Phoenix Park, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: And this Day at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment the Lords Justices upon that Occasion: And at Night there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies.
