And our Letters add, That the Garrison of Fastomies having fallied out, to repulse them, were beaten by them, and all killed, and taken ; after which, the Enemy took the Town and burnt it. In the mean time, the Bifhop of Marfeilles, Extraordinary Ambaffador from the most Chriftian King at this Court, affures his Majefly, that the King his Mafter will use all his endeavors to procure us a honorable Peace with the Turks, and that to that purpose he has sent Instructions to Monsieur de Nointel, his Ambaffador at the Port.

Rome, June 39, On Thursday laft, according to the Aunuil Cultom the Prince of Palestrina, who, for that purpofe, hid the Character of Ambaffador Extraordinary of the Crown of spain, aid homage to his Holinef, in the name of his Catholick Majelly, for the Kin\_dom of Naples : This Ceremony was performed with more then ordinary mignificence; for befiles the great numbers of Prelates, Nobili y, and other perfons of quality, who with their attendance allitted a. it, the Princes own Train and Equippage was extraordinary numerous and fplendid. It is reported, that the faid Prince is to fucceed the Marquels d'Aftorgas in the Govern-ment of Naples. Several Banditi of Naples having lately retired into the Ecclesiaftical Territories, the Marquess d'Aftorgis upon notice thereof fent to our Superiors to demand, that they might be put into his hands to receive the puniforment they had deferved, according to the Laws of that Kingdom ; which being refused, it seems the Marquels resolved to take them by force of Arms. For the twenty eighth inflant, the Governor of Ajcoli fent an Express hither to acquaint the Cardinal Patron, That the President of Laquita had with 2000 Men entred into the Ecclefisfical Territories, in purfuit of the faid Banditi, and that being informed that some of them had for their greater security, put themselves into a certain Castle not far from Ascoli; the faid Prefident attacked it, but that the Banditi allifted by the firength of the place, and the Countrey people thereabouts, had defended themfelves 3 till he (the Governor of Afcoli) having an account of what was doing, came with a confiderable party, drawn out of that Garrifon to their affiltance; the fight was fharply maintained on both fides, and lasted above four hours, when the Spanjards were forced to retreat, leaving many of their Companions dead behind them. Since the Bandici to revenge themselves on the Spaniards, have entred into the County of Abruzzo, and done much mischeif there. Our Superiors are much concerned hereat, and are defirous to find out fome mean to adjust this matter. The Pope has for these two or three days past been fome what indifpofed.

Berlin, July 3.
