Plimouth, July 17.

Y 2 Veffel arrived from Pori Louis in France we have advice, That the Dutch continue till upon the Iflund of Normantier, in the mouth of the River of Nanies; that 12 Men of War remain cruifing on the Coafts thereabouts, the reft of the Fleet being failed from thence, though it was not known whither.

Lisbon, July 7. The Corres continue as yet busied about raiting the Moneys, they have refolved to supply the Prince Regent with. Three Men of War who have been abroad to cruife, being come in, the Prince has Commanded that they, with two other Men of War that have been firted out here, shall forthwith fail to the Terceira's, to bring the King Alphonster hither.

Warlam, July 25. The Provincial Diets of this Kingdom that were affembled in order to the raifing a Fond, for the recruiting the Army, are every where finished, the Nobility having abfolutely refused to grant any Moneys, but have refolved that in cafe of necessity, the King shall be defired to call them all into the Field, and that they will with all readinefs appear there for the defence of the Kingdom, but this does not pleafe his Majelly, who had much rather have Moneys to raife an Army of 30 or 40 000 Men, for that they may be kept under difcipline, and be wholly at the Command of the General. The Palatine of Russia is at present on the Frontiers, where he endeavors to form a fmall Body of an Aimy, but the Soldiers for want of pay difband daily, fo that no great matters can be done. The Elector of Brandenburgh and the Duke of Courland will fend hither feveral Auxiliary Troops,

Coblents, July 23. On Thursday last dyed the Prince Regent of Wurtsfemberg, aged about 60 years, of an Apoplexy, leaving his Son, about 27 years old, to fucceed to his Effates; The Elector of Malence was likewife about eight days fince taken ill of an Apoplexy, to that degree, that his recovery was dispaired of, and hereceived the Extream Unition, though at prefent he is pretty well recovered; The Prince of Baden, Judge of the Amperial Chamber at Spire, is also dangerouly ill of an Apoplexy. On Friday last. Monsteur de Tarenne having custed his Quarters at Ladenburg to be fet on fire reparted the Neckar, and marched towards Philips! durg, where it is though ke will again pais the Rhyne : We are affured, that his Army confilts at prefent of 27000 fighting Men, and that daily more Troops arrive at Philipsbourg.

The Duke of Lournonville has still his Quarters at Florsh. im, two Leagues from Mayince; The Regiment of Croats Commanded by the Count de Loiron, arrived on Saturday last near Francfort, and the next, day they were to continue their match towards the Confederates Camp, where the Cologne Regiment Commanded by Count Veblo, is already arrived, and it is still that three Regiments more are on their match to joyn with them, viz. A Regiment of Foot Commanded by the Count de Reiffen, another of Horfe.

Commanded by the Baron de Messerniche, and the third of Dragoons, Commanded by Colonel Hoppingen.

Cologne, Iuly 24. From Lipfladt they write, that the Troops of the Elector of Brandenburgh will begin to march this week, which has very much allarmed the Bithop of Munfter, who thereupon has recalled his Troops that are now in the Imperial Army, though it is thought they will not be permitted to obey his Orders. We cannot yet learn whither the Brandenburgh Troops will direct their march.

Nimmegen, July 25: Yefterday marched from hence three Regiments of Foot, and three Troops of Horie, having with them fome fmall pieces of Cannon, and feveral Waggons laden with Spades, Shovels, and other. Inftruments neceffary for a Siege : towards evening we heard a great deal of fhooting, and not long after we. had advice, that our Troops had poffeffed themselves. of the Maes-Dyke, which is before Grave ; the French had fet Guards upon it, to fecure those that were on work there for the demolishing it, that so the Cannon of the place may the better bear upon the Befiegers; in which action we had about 25 men killed and wounded; about ten a clock this morning marched from hence three Regiments more, and feveral Troops of Cavalry (being the fame that had formerly their quarters in the Betawe) and fome hours after we had news, that they had made themselves Masters of the Redoubt, which the French have made before the Bridge near, Grave, fo that it is thought the 400 Horfe that have been sent out from that Place to fetch in Contributions, will hardly be able to get back again. This day arrived here Monsieur Rabenhaup's Regiment, and brought with them 12 Mortar-pieces, and it is believ-ed the faid Regiment, with fome other Troops, will march yet this night towards Greve, and that Monheur Rabenhaup will goe himfelf with them ; The Canon, Ammunition-Waggons, Stc. fland in the mean time ready on the Market-place here ; We are told that 1 500 Horfe, drawn out of Boiffeduc and other places in Brabant, have likewise approached Grave on the fide of Ravenstein, fo that that place will now infew days he formally belieged.

Gheni, fuly 27. On Sunday night and Monday morning 5000 Horfe of the Imperial Army pafied the Meufe at Namur, with their General, the Count de Souches, and many of the Principal Officers at the head of them, and advanced that day between fudoigne and Gemblours; the Generals Quarters being at Bonef Abby; the 4000 Spanish Cavalry under the Command of the Marquis d'Affentar being then encamped between fudoigne; and Wavre. On Tuefday General Souches and the Spanish Cavalry joyned; and the fame night the Count de Monterers arrived in the Prince of Oranges Camp between Hyleffer and Huys eard. On Wednelday morning the Prince of Ghanges, and the Spanish Cavalry for Anges General Souches, and the Count of Monterers met at Ianch, and had a long Conference, after which Oraders were, fent by General Souches, for his whole Aremy to pals the Meufe at Namer; which they have ac-

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
