Petersbourg, May 18.

HER Imperial Majesty intends to set out shortly for Petershoff, accompanied by the Great Duke and Great Dutchess, in order to spend Part of the Summer. Orders have been lately sent to Riga, for conveying the Corps of the late Field Marshal Count Lacy to a Roman Catholick Convent in Courland; in order to its Interment.

Parma, May 21. The Court continues its Residence at Colorno, where the Duke assists regularly at the Councils which are held twice a Week in order to concert Measures for putting the Finances upon a better Footing than they at present. We have received Advice from Reggio, that, upon the Complaints of the Foreign Merchants, of the great Losses they have sustained by the late continual Rains, the Duke of Modena, in order to make them some Recompence, and to encourage them to come another Time, had prolonged the Fair for a Fortnight, during which Time they are to enjoy all the Privileges usually allowed during the holding of the said Fair.

Rome, May 22. On Monday Morning last the Pope held a secret Consistory at the Quirinal, in order to confirm several Archbishops and Bishops in their respective Archbishopricks and Bishopricks. The last Advices from Civita Vecchia say, that in Conformity to the Orders they had lately received, they were working with the utmost Diligence on several of the Pope's Gallies, which they hoped to get soon to Sea, in order to cruize on the Barbary Corsairs, who very much infest the Coasts of the Ecclesiastical State.

Turin, May 26. Last Monday about Seven o'Clock in the Morning her Royal Highness the Dutchess of Savoy was safely deliver'd of a Prince, and both continue perfectly well. At Ten the same Morning the Prince was christen'd by the Cardinal de Lances, by the Names of Charles-Emanuel-Ferdinand-Maria. The King of Sardinia, and Madame de Savoye, were Sponsors for the King and Queen of Spain; the Great Officers of the Crown assisted at the Ceremony, and the Foreign Ministers were likewise present. As the Court was in Mourning for the late King of Sweden, they went out of it for three Days, and Yesterday all the Royal Family attended at a Te Deum on this Occasion.

Vienna, May 29. The Journey her Imperial Majesty intends making to Cremnitz in Upper Hungary, in order to view the Mines of that Place, is fixed for the 3d of next Month, during which Time she proposes staying at Presbourg, in order to facilitate the Resolutions of the Diet. The Camp intended to be formed by the Imperial Troops in the Neighbourhood of Pest, under the Command of Prince Lichtenstein, is not to take Place till after the Harvest is got in. And the Regiments named for forming the Camps of Colin and Pilsen in Bohemia, are ordered not to take the Field till the Beginning of August, as the Inhabitants there may not be disturbed in getting in their Harvest.

Berlin, June 1. This Morning the King, accompanied by the three Princes his Brothers, a numerous Retinue of General Officers, and other Persons of Distinction, set out from Potzdam for Pitzphul, in order to review Tomorrow Morning four Regiments of Horse, which were ordered to encamp at that Place. From thence his Majesty proposes going to Magdebourg, to review the Regiments of Foot of Prince Anhalt Dessau, Bonin, Bredow, Borcke, Kleist and Derschaw. After which he proposes taking a Tour to Wolfembüttel, Minden, Bielefeld, Lingen, Embden, Aurich, Stapelnohr, Wezel and Cleves, and then return to Potzdam, which he proposes reaching by the 24th Instant.

Flushing, June 6. The Ceremony of installing his Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, in Quality of Marquess of this Place, was performed here Yesterday with the greatest Magnificence.

Middleburg, June 7. His Serene Highness the Prince Stadtholder is returned here from Flushing, where he made his publick Entry on Saturday last in Quality of Marquess; and this Day assisted at the Assembly of the States of this Province.

Hague, June 8. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland are to re-assemble on Wednesday next, the usual Notices having been dispatched for that Purpose. His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange is expected here from Zealand towards the latter End of this Week or the Beginning of next; and the Review of the Regiments in Garrison here, is expected to be made by his Serene Highness a few Days after.
