The Secretary of State has received Notice, that two of the King's Gallies, cruizing off the Presidii, had on the 4th Instant, taken a Tunisine Corsair, with 15 Moors on Board (the rest of its Crew having escaped on Shore) then at Anchor under a small Fort in the Island del Giglio, belonging to Tuscany; and that the Gallies had rescued a Neapolitan Bark, loaden with Wine, that had been taken by the said Corsair. This Event has given great Satisfaction to the Publick, especially as it is confidently reported, that our Court will not hatken to any Sollicitations for the Restitution of the said Corsair. A most scandalous Libel is handed about this City against the Neapolitan Nobility of both Sexes, who are greatly offended at it; infomuch, that the King has given his positive Orders to the supreme Judge of the Criminal Court, to use his utmost Endeavours to discover the Author.

Rome, June 26.
