Naples, Jaly 27. The King propoles letting but next Week for the Island of Procida, in order to take the Diversion of hunting for some Days. We are informed by the Masters of several Ships that are just arrived here from the Coast of Sicily, that on the 11th Instant two violent Earthquakes happened at Palermo, and in that Neighbourhood, by which a great Number of Houses had been very much damaged. During the Course of last Week fisteen more of the Banditti, who have lately infested the publick Roads of this Kingdom, were brought here under a strong Guard and committed to Prison.

Rome, July 31. Last Monday Night the Inhabitants of this City were greatly alarmed by a violent Shock of an Earthquake, which however went off without doing any confiderable Damage. M. Cervini, Patriarch of Jerufalem, died here on Thursday last, very much advanced in Years. Florence, July 31. Count Richecourt; Prefident of the Regency, is indefatigable in his Endeavours to bring to Perfection the great Road that is making over the Mountains of this State to Bologna; from whence 'tis expected our Commerce will reap great Advantages. We learn from the Romagna, that they have felt feveral flight Shocks of an Earthquake within these few Days past, but that happily they had done very little Damage. Florence, Aug. 6. On the 1st Instant an Express arrived here from Siena with Notice, that the Evening before, whilft they were acting an Opera, an accidental Fire broke out in the Theatre, which was foon quite destroyed by the Flames. Genoa, Aug. 2. We are waiting here with great Impatience to learn what Refolutions will be taken at the General Affembly that is now holding at San Fiorenzo, in Relation to the Affairs of Corfica. The Master of a Ship arrived here on Saturday laft from Naples fays, that one of our armed Barks, which has been cruizing for fome Time off Cape Colonna, had been taken, after a fmart Engagement, by a Tunefian Chebeck, and carried into the Port of Otranto. Our laft Letters from Madrid fay, that the King of Spain, upon a Reprefentation made to him of the great Want of **People** in general, and particularly of Handycraftimen, in the West Indies, had agreed to allow fome peculiar Privileges and Exemptions to fuch of his Subjects or others as fhould be willing to go thither, and exercise their Trades. Turin, Aug. 3. On Wednesday the King, accompanied by all the Royal Family, and attended by feveral of the principal Lords and Ladies of the Court, went on a Party of Pleafure in a Gondola upon the River Po. . His Majefty has appointed the Count de Brilqueralque, Governor of the Duke of Chablais, to be Viceroy of the Kingdom of Sardinia, in the Room of Don Emmanuel de Valguarnera, whofe three Years is expired, being the Time that Place is usually enjoyed,

Branfwick, Aug. 6. Venice, Aug. 6. Great Disturbances have lately happened at Crema, on Account of the Dearnefs of Corn and Provisions, which obliged the People to complain to the Podesta, defiring that the Syndicks might, regulate the Prices of them, and it was accordingly done to their Satisfaction: But the Podesta being highly difpleafed with the Behaviour of these Magistrates, ordered them to be put into Prifon. Upon this the People rose, and threatened to murder the Podesta, unless he released them; who apprehending they would put their Menaces in Execution, acquainted the Senate of his Situation Whereupon Signior Mosto, an Inquisitor, was immediately fent with full Powers, who, foon after his Arrival, caused the three Syndicks it be hanged, and condemned feveral of the Ring. leaders of the Riot to the Galleys. These Proceedings greatly irritated the People, who not daring to attack the Troops the Inquisitor had + brought with him, retired in great Numbers into the State of Milan, and those who remained, declared they would no longer obey the. Governors fent by the Republick. In this State of Things it was thought necessary to try other Methods, and Signior Luigi Pisani, Governor of Palma, was fent with Offers of a General Pardon, and Promifes from the Senate to redrefe the Grievances complained of, which has fucceeded, and thereby an End is put to an Affair which could not but give great Uneafines here, They write from Naples, that in Confequence of an Edict lately published there against the Free Masons, several Persons have aleady been taken up and put into Prison. Vienna, Aug. 7. Yesterday an Express arrived here with Advice, that on Wednesday Evening laft their Imperial Majefties reached Buda, where they refted that Night, and the next Morning fet out for the Camp, where they proposed staying five or fix Days. On Thursday a long Conference was held at Field Marshal Count Konigfeck's, at which Marshal Bathiany, and the Counts Colloredo and Uhlefeldt affifted. The fame Day a Fire broke out at a Baker's House at Nusdorff, about a League from hence, which burnt with fuch Violence, that upwards of thirty Houses were confumed before a Stop could be put to it. Breslau, Aug. 8. Great Preparations are making for the King's Reception, who is expected here towards the End of this Month; and all the Regiments quartered in this Province have Orders to hold them felves in Readinels against that Time to be reviewed by his Majefty.
