T is fill uncertain when his Majefly will go into the Campagne, things being as yet in no readinels, notwithstanding his Majesty uses all endeavors possible, to put them into some posture. This makes many people very much defire a Peace, and we have good reason to hope, that the Mediation of the most Christian King may procure is; for till the Nobility be more able or more willing to contribute to the Charges of the War, it is in vain to have any thoughts of profiting by it; But our good fortune is; That the affairs of the Grand Signior are neither in any very good condition, which inclines him to a Peace. The Queen Dowager is gone towards Pruffia, to re-fide, as we formerly told you at Thorne. We have news that the Mulcovites have taken the firing Forreas in the Ukrain, in which Derosensto, General of the Robel Coffocks, hed endeavoured to fecure himfelf; and that he with feveral others of his chief Officers had been taken prifoners. The Palatine of Kiovia, who is on the Econtiers, has written to acquaint his Majelly, that the Tartars were retired out of Hodo 11.

Vienna, July 25. The Extraordinary Courier that was lately fent to the Court of the Elector of Brandenburgh, is returned with Letters from the Baron de Goes, the Emperors Minister there, which affure, that the Brandenburgh Troops will now fuddainly begin to march towards the Pal-tituate. From Hungary they write, that the 18 infort the Rebels took near Eperies, 30 Waggons laden with rich Merchandifes of a great value. We have advice that the Muscovires having entred with a great Army into the Territories of the Chim of Tartary, the Tartars that had made an incursion into Podolis, had been forced to return home to defend themfelves. The Poles are very backward in their preparations for this Campagne, and it is well the Turkih Army does not as yet appear near their Tersitories,

Hambrough, July 31. From Nyenbourg on the Wefer they write, That the Troops of Prince George William of Brunfwyck and Lunenburgh, are appointed to Rendez vous in their neighborhood, and that accordingly they are coming together'; That in a day or two would be held a general Review, in the prefence of his Highness and the Count de Grammone Envoye from the Crown of Spain; That the Train of Artillery, Ammunition, &c. were expected to arrive there this day ; and that there Forces which are to be Commanded by the Duke of Holfleyn Ploen, in quality of Marefchal de Camp General, by the Sieur Chauver as Lieutenant-General, and the Sieur d' Ende as Major-General, will march immediately after the Review, and are to be joyned by tholeof the Prince of Brunfwyck Wolfembuitel, after having passed the Wefer at Heuxter at Paderborne.

Strasburgh, July 31. The French continue to work |

with great diligence on the Fortifications at Eastaw, which they hope to have now fliddainly finished. We are affured that Mönfieur de Tarenne having repassed the Rhyne at Phylipsbourg, had on Sunday last his Offarters at Landaw; Several Couriers pais in the mean time to and fros which makes People conjecture, there is fome great defigne inhand. Bon, Aug. 3. Our Letters from the Palatinate and vile us, That Monfieur de Turenne had on Sunday la his Quarrers at Lundam (the first Imperial City in ML fatia towards Germany) which is the way to Larrating the Letters from strasbourg confirm the fame, and tell us, that Monfieur de Turenne is going towards Flanders, to joyn with the Prince of Conce. The Duke of Bournonville flirs not as yet from his Charters at Flort Jbeim, but is making a Bridge of Boars there over the stain, in order to his paling it, to foun as he is rein-forced with the Troops that all on their march to: wares bim ; It is faid, be hath defred fome Boars of the City of Francfort, for the making the faid Bridge, the but that they refuled them, beent on he had not reflored the Boats they formerly lent him to make a Bridge over the Main near Francfort. There is a Neutrality Treating between the City of Fridarg in Bragovin, and Brijas, the Emperor having to that end fent ample power to the Governor of Pribourg. The States of the Circle of Franconia are fill affembled at Nuremberg. but have not as yet concluded any thing concerning the fending of their Troops to joyn with the Duke of Bournonville. We have just now advice from Spire, that Monfieur de Turenne marches with his Army towards Frankendal; which makes it thought, he has a defign to befiege it.

Hague, Avg. 7. The Siege of Grave advances very flowly, we having not Troops enough there to carry it on, and our Cannon not being as yet arrived, not the Boats which are to make the Bridges for the tommunication of the Quarters. The befieged in the mean time make use of their Canon against us, without any intermission, but have not done any great harm, for it is faid, not above fix perfons have as yet been kil-led in our Camp by their great fhot. The Letters we receive this morning from Bruffels tell us, That the Armies were encamped in the neighborhood of Nivelle and that this day they intended to march nearer to the Prince of conde, to invite him to a Battel, Monfieur de Turenne; according to our advices from Germany, has repatied the Rhyne at Philipsbourg ; and we are told, though without any certainty, that he marches towards Lotrain. We have not any news from our Fleer, and the Letters from France make hardly shy mention of it, as if it was not on their Coafts; and the difcourfe now here is, That their intention is not to attempt any great matters, but only keep the French in a contidual Allafmi, while Lieutenant-Admiral de Ruytér
