

Preparations are already making for that Purpose.

*Copenhagen, Sept. 28.* On Saturday last all the Field Equipage belonging to the Regiments here in Garrison, were viewed by the King's express Orders, and afterwards deposited in the Arsenal of this City. We have received Advice, that a Ship belonging to our West India Company has been entirely destroyed by Fire in the North Sea, but no one could tell how the Accident happened: The Crew had the good Fortune to save themselves on board a Dutch Ship.

*Franckfort, Oct. 2.* The Elector of Mayence, who has been for some Days taking the Diversion of Hunting at Stenheim, is returned to Aschaffembourg, where he proposes to stay till the End of the Month. Recruiting for the Imperial Troops goes on very successfully both in this City, and in all the neighbouring Villages, several considerable Bodies having been lately sent away to join their respective Regiments.

*Cologne, Oct. 4.* The Baron de Burmania, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General of the United Provinces to their Imperial Majesties, arrived here on Thursday last, and on the Saturday following continued his Journey for Vienna. 'Tis said he takes his Route by Munich, in order to execute a private Commission with the Elector of Bavaria. This Day a general Discharge was made of the Cannon upon the Ramparts of this City, on Account of its being the Feast of St. Francis, whose Name the Emperor bears.

*Brussels, Oct. 4.* A few Days ago a considerable Number of Beaver Hats were seized in the Shop of a principal Dealer in this City; the same having been run in from France without paying the new Duty imposed by the late Edict. They write from Liege, that the States of that Bishoprick have given their Consent to the Project for cutting a Canal from Hasselt to Bois-le-Duc, and for making a new paved Road from Liege to Viset.

*Dusseldorp, Oct. 5.* The Corps of the late Electress of Bavaria, which was carried from Ahaus to Munster, conformable to the Intentions of the Court of Munich, was interred Yesterday with great Funeral Pomp in the Cathedral Church of that City.

*Amsterdam, Oct. 6.* His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange has confirmed the Nomination of the Directors of our East-India Company, by appointing M. Mossel to be Governor General of the Dutch Settlements in the Indies.

*Cologne, Oct. 7.* We learn by our last Letters from Upper Austria, that a dreadful Fire had lately broke out at Ottensheim, a small Town about a Mile from Lintz, which burnt with great Violence, and reduced to Ashes one hundred and ten Houses besides the Parish Church.

*Hague, Oct. 7.* Our Lords the States of this Province, who were assembled on Tuesday and

### General Post Office.

Whereas the Post-Boy bringing the Cirencester Mail to this Office, was Yesterday Morning, between Two and Three of the Clock, on Gerrard's Cross Common, between Wickham and Uxbridge, attacked and robbed by a single Highwayman, mounted on a Bay Mare, who carried off the said Mail, which contained the following Bags of Letters, viz.

The Person who committed this Robbery, was a tall lusty black Man, about Six Feet high, between Forty and Fifty Years of Age, marked with the Small Pox, and had on a blue Surtout or Horseman's Coat, and under it a dark coloured one, with white Metal Buttons, and wore a black or dark coloured Wig, and rode upon a large Brown Bay Horse or Mare, Fifteen Hands high, with a bald Face, and a dark black Mane, the Tail lately docked and nicked, the Wounds not healed.

This therefore is to give Notice, That whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen: Or if any Person or Persons, whether Accomplice in the said Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery, whereby the Person, who committed the same, may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer or Discoverers will, upon Conviction of the Party, be intitled to the same Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, and also have His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
