Francfort, Aug. 5. Our Letters from Philipshourg tell. us, that Monfieur de Turenne after having quicted Nem-fladt, marches towards strachotr, with intentions to pass by Savern into Lorrin, and so towards the Meuje, to joyn, as is fuid, with the Prince of Conde; Yesterday Colonel Dunemalt (who hash been fent out from the Confederate Army at Fio fbeim, with a Body of Horfe) paffed the Rhyne at Marheim, and took his way towards Key/erlauter, to attack the French in their Rear. This day the Duke of Bournonville paffes likewife the Main at Flor fleim ; who as foon as the Lunenburg nid Brandenburgh Troops, arrive, which, may be in i or 12 days, will attempt fomething confiderable. We are told, that the Emperor has fent to acquaint the Duke of Bon no ville, that he cannot fend him any more Troops out of his Hereditary Countreys, feeing he is obliged to keep I is Forces together on the Frontiers of Bavaria, to have an eye upon the motions of that Elector. The Bishop of Wurtsburg has fent 600 Foot more to joyn with the Confederates. It is reported here, shat the Marquis de Bareyth, upon fome difference between him and the Duke of Bournonville, is about leaving the Army. On Tuesday the Prince of Vaudemont went out with 1 200 Horfe to discover the pollure of the Enemy, and returned with advice, that they continue in their Camp behind Picton. The fame day a Datch Caprain went out with 70 Horfe to get fome boory, but fell into an Ambuth, and was cur off by the French, the fald Caprain and two, or three men only cfcaping; This day went from Bruffels a great Convoy, and with it 30 pieces of Canon; above food Carriages of all kinds, two Morrar-pieces, great quantity of Granadoes, Ammunition, and Materials for a Siege; and about the fame time arrived at Bruffers another Convoy from the Airry, which is to "ieturn again to morrow.
