liable to Corporal Punishment, Imprifonment, or Fine, for the same, at the Discretion of such of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, where the Profecution for such Offence shall be commenced.

And every Perfon fo offending may be feized, and brought to England, and committed to Goal there, by any one of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, until fufficient Security be given by Naturalborn Subjects or Denizens, to appear in the Court, where fuch Profecution shall be commenced, to answer the fame, and not depart without Leave of the Court.

3d Geo. II. Cap. 14.] By an Act paffed In the 3d Year of His prefent Majesty, it is Enacted, That if any of His Majesty's Subjects (other than the East-India Company, and those licensed by them,) shall directly, or indirectly, go to, trade, or adventure into, or from, the East-Indies, every fuch Offender shall incur the Forfeiture, and Lois, of all the Ships, and Veffels, employed in fuch Voyage, Trade, or Adventure; and alfo all the Goods laden thereupon, or that were fent to, acquired, traded or adventured, within the East-Indies, and all the Proceed, and Effects, of the fame, and Double the Value thereof.

Dresden, Jan. 22. On Monday last the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation was celebrated at Court, when their Majesties dined in Publick with all the young Princes and Princeffes of the Royal Family. According to out last Advices from Poland, the Heyducks have appeared lately in great Numbers upon the Frontiers of the Ukraine; where they have not only plundered divers Villages, but even attack'd several Posts occupied by Russian Troops, Mayence, Jan. 26. The Deputies of the States of the Upper Rhine, who affembled a Fortnight ago at Franckfort, have already agreed to feveral Schemes that were laid before them for raifing of Money, which are foon to be communicated to the States of the other Circles of the Empire for their Approbation; and 'tis not doubted but this important Affairwill foon be agreed to entirely to the Emperor's Satisfaction.

Berlin, Jan. 26. The King has given Count Reichenbach, Post-Master-General of the Dutchy of Silesia, a Perpetuity in that Office, to which a confiderable Salary is annexed; and M. de Freneau, Chancellor of the Dutchy of Guelderland, is appointed Intendant of the Fiefs of that Dutchy. On Monday laft, being the King's Birth-Day, when he entred into the 52d Year of his Age, the fame was celebrated at Court with great Magnificence, all the Nobility and Foreign Ministers appearing at the Palace to compliment his Majesty on that Occafion. We have received Advice from Cuftrin, that M. de Friedeborn, Commandant of that City, died there on the 14th Instant, in an advanced Age. Arnheim, Jan. 28. Her Royal Highness the Princess Governante has appointed the Barons Bentinck and Zuylen van Nievelt, to be Burgomasters of this Town for the Year enfuing; and her Royal Highness has confirmed the other Magistrates in their Posts for three Years as ufual. Amsterdam, Jan. 31. The Captain of a Ship lately arrived in the Texel, has put ten Men on Shore that he had the good Fortune to fave out of an English Ship that perished fome Time fince off Cape Finisterre. Hague, Feb. 1. The Magistrates of this Place have ordered all the Avenues to the Publick Streets through which the Funeral Procession of his late Serene Highness the Prince of Orange is to pairs on Friday next, to be fhut up; the Publick Market that used to be kept on that Day to be postponed; and all the faid Streets to be thoroughly cleanfed the Night before.

Gibraltar, Dec. 27. A few Days ago we received an Account, that one of the Dutch 20 Gun Ships on this Station, in a Cruize against the Moors, was, by a Storm, drove a Shore at a Place called Rio Negron, about 25 Miles to the Eastward of Tetuan; Ten of the Crew perished, and the Captain, whose Name is Steenhurst, with the rest of the Crew, about 130, were made Captives by the Moors, and fent up to Mequinez.

Stockholm, Jan. 15. They write from Finland, that upon Advice received there of the King's Intention to visit that Country next Spring, they were already making divers Preparations for his Majesty's Reception. The fame Letters add, that they have lately felt a fevere Shock of an Earthquake in feveral Places in that Province, and particularly at Swansky, but that it had done very little Damage. Vienna, Jan. 22. Repeated Advices having been received at Court of the Plague's having entirely ceased at Constantinople, it is generally believed that Orders will fpeedily be difpatched to the Officers of the Troops posted upon the Frontiers of Hungary, to return to their respective Quarters. General Count Wallis, on whom her Imperial Majesty has conferred the Government of Transilvania, in the Room of the late Count Bernes, has received his final Instructions, and will fet out shortly to take upon him that Government. The States of the Archdutchy of Auffria have come to a **Resolution to make the Empress a free Gift of** 125000 Florins to defray the Expences of erecting the Military School at Neufladt. The young Prince of Brandenbourg Anfpach is appointed to the Command of a Regiment of Cuiraffiers, in the Room of Field Marshal Ba-
