And every Perfon to offending may be feized, and brought to England, and committed to Goal there, by any one of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, until fufficient Security be given by Naturalborn Subjects or Denizens, to appear in the Court, where fuch Profecution shall be commenced, to answer the fame, and not depart without Leave of the Court.

3d Geo. II. Cap. 14.] By an Act paffed in the 3d Year of His present Majesty, it is Enacted, That if any of His Majesty's Subjects (other than the Eaft-India Company, and those licensed by them,) shall directly, or indirectly, go to, trade, or adventure into, or from, the East-Indies, every fuch Offender shall incur the Forfeiture, and Lofs, of all the Ships, and Veffels, employed in fuch Voyage, Trade, or Adventure; and also all the Goods laden thereupon, or that were fent to, acquired, traded or adventured, within the East-Indies, and all the Proceed, and Effects, of the fame, and Double the Value thereof.

Letters from Podolia, and other Provinces on the Frontiers, that Count Branicky, General of the Crown Army, has taken such prudent Precautions in the posting of his Troops, that no confiderable Body of Heyducks have ventured to shew themselves for some Weeks past.

Hambourg, Feb. 25. M. Ponifo, the Spanifh Conful, fets out this Evening or To-morrow Morning for the Hague, agreeable to the Orders he received by the last Post to quit this City immediately.

Brussels, Feb. 28. 'Tis faid the States of Brabant have at last come to a Resolution to rebuild the ancient Palace that was burnt down, and that the fame will be begun as soon as the necessary Funds are provided. They continue working at the Canal from Bruges to Ghent, and 'tis thought it will be finished by the End of the Summer.

Groninguen, Feb. 28. Her Royal Highnels the Princels Governante has been pleafed to augment the Number of Professions in this University, who are to read publick Lectures, viz. Mess. Bertling and Hollebeek on Theology; Mess. Schwartz and Rukkers on Law and Equity; M. Lennep on the Oriental Languages; M. Wynpers on Philosophy; and M. Moine on the English and French Languages.

Naples, Feb. 8. The great Rains that have fallen in this Country for fome Days paft, have made the Roads impaffable in many Places, to the great Hindrance of Commerce; and even fome of the Couriers are obliged to go many Miles about before they can reach this City. A few Days ago the Aid Major of Barri's Regiment, who went off fome Months fince with a confiderable Sum of Money he was intrufted with to purchase Cloth for that Regiment, was apprehended at Capua, where he has ever fince fecreted himfelf, and last Week he was escorted to this Place by a Detachment of Grenadiers, and committed to Prison.

TO Bon, Feb 19. The Elector our Sovereign proposes to leave Munich on the 8th or 9th of next Month on his Return hither, ' The great Qu ntity of Snow that has fallen here of late, has added greatly to the Diversions of the Carnival, as many of the Nobility and Gentry are almost daily Coursing in Sledges. We learn by our last Letters from Franckfort, that all the Imperial Officers in that City and its Neighbourhood, who have been there recruiting for fome Time, have received Orders to repair to their respective Regiments, in order to be prefent at the General Reviews, that are appointed for the Month of April next. The fame Letters add that the French continue to buy up great Quantities of Corfi in the Lower Palatinate, and in the Dutchy of Wirtembourg, in order to fill their new Magazines in Alface. Rome, Feb. 12. The Differences which fub-Jiffed between this Court and that of Modena, are at last happily adjusted, and the Marques Salvatico, who came here for that Purpose from Modena, is preparing to return to his Court. Warlaw, Reb. 19. Their Majeffies are expected here in the Month of May next, and 'tis faid they will be accompanied by the Princes Charles and Xavier: They propose to flay here fome Part of the Summer, and then go to Grodno, in the Great Dutchy of Lithuania, to affift at the General Diet of the States of that Kingdom, which is to allemble in the Beginning of October. We are informed by
