

The King has been pleased to appoint ———
Lindsey, Esq; to be Captain of that Company

Earl of Glasgow was late Captain, in the Re-
giment of Foot commanded by Lieutenant Ge-
neral John Johnson.

Dublin, May 2.

Yesterday his Grace the Lord Lieutenant
went to the House of Peers with the usual So-
lemnity, and the Commons being sent for, his
Grace gave the Royal Assent to the following
Bills, viz.

*An Act for explaining and amending the several
Laws now in Being, relating to the Workhouse
in the City of Dublin, so far as the same relates
to the Rates of Hackney Coaches, and Hackney
Coachmen, and Sedan Chairs, and Chairmen, in
and about the said City.*

*An Act for repairing the Road, leading from
the Town of Clonmell, in the County of Tippera-
ry, through the Towns of Feathard and Killinall,
in the said County, to the Town of Hurlingford,
in the County of Kilkenny.*

*An Act for making and repairing the Road,
leading from the Town of Athy, in the County of
Kildare, through Part of the Queen's County,
and through the Town of Castlecomer, in the
County of Kilkenny, to the Town of Old Leigh-
lin, in the County of Carlow, and from thence
to and through the Town of Leighlin Bridge, in
the said County of Carlow.*

*An Act for making and repairing the Road,
leading from the Town of Mountrath, in the
Queen's County, through the Towns and Lands
of Little Frankford, Galrus and Cloniver, in the
King's County, to the Town and Lands of Clone-
fin, in the said County.*

*An Act for establishing an Infirmary in the
City of Corke, and to vest the House called the
Infirmary House, and the back Yard thereunto
belonging, which is built at the East End of the
Church Yard of St. Mary Shandon, otherwise
St. Ann's, in the Liberties of the City of Corke,
in certain Trustees for ever, and to give such
Trustees such Powers as may be necessary to pro-
mote and execute the Purposes of an Infirmary in
the City of Corke, and for uniting several small
Parishes in the Suburbs of the said City.*

Admiralty-Office, April 30, 1752.

His Majesty having been graciously pleased, by his
Warrant under his Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th
of June, 1733, to establish certain Rules and Orders
for the Relief of Poor Widows of Commission and War-
rant Officers of the Royal Navy: These are to give No-
tice, that Copies of the said Rules and Orders are
lodged with the Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy at
Chatham, Portsmouth, and Plymouth; as also with the
Clerks of the Checque at Deptford, Woolwich, and
Sheerness; and with the Naval Officers at Harwich,
Deal, and Kinsale; where all such Widows as intend
to lay in their Claims, may be informed of all Particu-

lars which entitle them to the Benefit of the said Cha-
rity, and receive the proper Certificates for that Pur-
pose. But such Widows as live at too great a Distance
from the Places above-mentioned, may apply by Letter to
Mr. Thomas Riley Blanckley, at the Admiralty Office, who
will send them all necessary Information. And the Gov-
ernors of the said Charity-intending to distribute to the
Widows of Sea Officers who died before the 30th of
August 1732, as well as to the Widows of those who
died since that Time, whose Circumstances come within
the Rules of the Establishment, such Monies as may be
due to them on the 31st Day of May next; This is to give
Notice, that any Widows who have not yet ap-
plied, and intend to lay in their Claims, may do so
as soon as possible; and that all such Widows whose
Claims have been already allowed, may send or bring
to this Office, by the 31st of next Month, the Affida-
vits required by the Rules, in order to their being con-
tinued upon the Pension or Bounty.

The Right Hon. the Lords Commissioners of His Ma-
jesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying
Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 30th of June to
the 31st of December 1751, according to his Ma-
jesty's Establishment on that Behalf;

These are to give Notice, that the said Payment
will begin to be made at the Treasurer of the
Navy's Office in Broad Street, on Tuesday the 26th
Instant, at Eight o'Clock in the Morning, and continued
the following Day, beginning at the same Hour.
That all Persons may then and there attend to receive
what may become payable unto them, and not only
bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not
having enjoyed the Benefit of any publick Employment,
either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to
be paid the said Half Pay, but also produce Certificates
that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the
Oaths required by Act of Parliament to his present Ma-
jesty. And in Case any of the said Sea Officers shall not
be able to attend themselves to receive their Money,
but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said
Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affida-
vits from the Persons they are employed by.
