*Dusseldorp, June 22.* The latter End of last Week, a great Number of German Families, bound for Nova Scotia, where they are going to reside, failed down the Rhine in Barks, in order to go on Board the Ships provided for them.

*Versailles, June 23.* On Friday last the King went to take the Diversion of Hunting in the Forest of Rambouillet. The next Day his Majesty dined at Trianon, and went in the Afternoon to Choisy, from whence his Majesty returned hither on Monday Evening; and the next Day he admitted Count Kaunitz Rittberg, Ambassador from their Imperial Majesties, to a private Audience. The Duke of Deux Ponts, who has been here some Time under the Name of Count Sponheim, took Leave of their Majesties and the Royal Family on Friday Morning last, and the next Day set out on his Return Home. The Queen, who has been for some Days past indisposed with a Cold, is now perfectly recovered, and went Yesterday to dine with the Dutchess of Penthièvre at Putteaux. They write from Madrid, that the King has conferred on the Counts Bagnos and Aguilar the Title of Grandees of Spain; and that his Majesty has named Don Manuel Murillo d'Argaiz to the vacant Bishoprick of Segovia, and appointed Don Juan de Parados to be Governor of Oran.

*Hague, June 27.* The States of Holland and Westfrizeland are to assemble on the 12th of next Month. The Baron de Waffenaer, Ambassador from this Court to that of Spain, proposes to set out from hence in a few Days for Madrid.
