Rome, June 10. Last Week the Chevalier Capello, the Venetian Ambaffador to the Pope, was taken dangeroufly ill of a malignant Fever; on Notice whereof, the Pope fent his own Phyfician to visit and attend him; and, by the last Accounts, there were fome Hopes of his Recovery. Florence, June 12. The French Ministers and Confuls have had repeated Advices from divers Parts, that the Tripolines had broke the Peace with their Court, which has alarmed the Subjects of that Nation, their Trade to the Levant being thereby exposed to much Danger. Several French Barks bound thither, returned to Leghorn a few Days ago; others, that were advanced on their Voyage, having received the fame Advices at Sea, returned back, and few, or none, will venture, for the present, to fail for those Parts. It is faid, that four or fix French Ships of War from Toulon are cruizing to protect their Trade, and the French, in these Parts, suppose that more Ships will be put to Sea to keep the Tripolines in Awe till their Court takes fome more vigorous Measures on this Occasion. We have not received any farther Advices relating to the Infurrection at Tunis, except that the Bey's Son had dispatrked a Veffel with Letters for Leghorn; but that the Bey having had Notice thereof, caufed three Barks to be fent after it, which overtook the faid Vessel, out of which they seized the Letters, and carried them back to the Bey. Petersbourg, June 13. Her Imperial Majefty has lately granted fome new Privileges to the Coffacks of Malorofch : These People are very numerous, and very proper to be employed in warlike Expeditions. Baron Greiffenheim, the Swedish Envoy, has taken his Leave of the Empress, and of the Great Duke and Great Dutchess, and proposes setting out from hence in a few Days, being appointed by his Swedish Majefty

Naples, June 6. On the 28th past died of an Apoplectick Fit the Marquess Roti, Prefident of the King's Chamber; to which Post his Majesty, on the 1st Instant, appointed M.
