Places, and laid great Part of the adjacent Country under Water; that the Rapidity of the Stream was fo fudden and fo great, as to deftroy most of the Bridges upon that River; and that feveral People, who lived near its Banks, were drowned, with most of their Cattle.

Dussel dorp, Sept. 5. According to our last Advices from Bonn, the Elector of Cologn was daily expected there from his Journey into Westphalia. The Desertion amongst the Troops in this Garrison is become more frequent of late than ever; and, by our best Accounts, the greatest Part of them take the Road to Wesel, and enter into the Service of the King of Prussia.

Hague, Sept. 7. Count Bentinck, who has been for some Time at his Seat in Guelderland, is returned here, and affifts regularly at the Affembly of their High Mightinesse the States General.
