

*Petersbourg, Nov. 7.* The Troops which were all last Summer cantoned on the Frontiers of Finland, are now actually on their March from thence, Part for the Suburbs of Moscow, and the rest for the Neighbourhood of Novogrod, where they are to go into Winter Quarters. For these two Days past we have had such violent Storms, that the River Neva has overflowed its Banks, and laid all the lower Part of the City under Water, by which Accident a deal of Mischief is done in divers Ground Floors and Cellars that were made use of as Warehouses.

*Genoa, Nov. 10.* The Great and Little Council have often assembled of late on the Affairs of Corsica, which are at present in a very critical Situation, the Inhabitants persisting in their Resolution of refusing to accept the new Regulation proposed by the French. The Master of a Pink, who arrived here a few Days ago from Ischia reports, that he met, off Monte Argentero, a Maltese Ship conducting Home a large Corsair that he had taken in the Seas of Tuscany, after a smart Engagement of six Hours, in which several were killed and wounded on both Sides.

*Rome, Nov. 11.* The Corps of the late Cardinal Riviera was carried on Monday last to the Church of the Holy Apostles, where it was interred with great Solemnity, at which the Pope, and several Members of the Sacred College assisted. The same Day the young Prince Lambertini, the Pope's Nephew, arrived here from Bologna, and was received with great Affection.

*Copenhagen, Nov. 15.* The King has appointed Mess. Heespen and Arnold, Counsellors of State, to be two of his Majesty's Counsellors of Conference. They are equipping, with all Expedition, our Asiatick Company's Ships for China and Tranquebar.

*Stockholm, Nov. 16.* On the 5th Instant their Majesties left Drottningholm with the whole Court, and came to reside here for the Winter; since which his Majesty has been slightly indisposed for a Day or two, but he is now perfectly recovered. An Express is arrived here with Advice, that Part of the Russian Troops are actually on their March from Finland into the interior Parts of that Empire, which News gives great Satisfaction here, and shews the good Harmony that at present subsists between the two Courts. The Frost is set in very severe, and for two Days past there has fallen such a vast Quantity of Snow, that it is already eight Foot deep in some Places. We hear from Gottenbourg, that the Frederick Adolphus, and the Gotha, two of our East-India Company's Ships, are almost ready to sail for Canton; and that the Prince Charles, another of that Company's Ships, is getting ready with all Expedition, in order to sail for Surat.

*Warsaw, Nov. 16.* Their Polish Majesties, accompanied by the Princes Charles and Xavier, continue here in perfect Health, and often take the Diversion of Hunting. We are informed by private Letters from several of the Palatines of this Kingdom, that they were greatly surprized at the almost sudden and unsuccessful breaking up of the late General Diet; and the rather, as they had the greatest Reason to believe the same would have been attended with Success.

*Vienna, Nov. 18.* The Marquess de Hautefort, who has resided here for some Years past in Quality of Ambassador from the Court of

France, set out from hence on Thursday Morning last, on his Return to Paris. This Week an Ordonnance was published here, requiring the Clergy to make out, for the Use of the Archbishop's Consistorial Court, an exact Account of what Livings they are now possessed of, where those Livings are situated, how much they produce yearly, what Taxes they are liable to, and in whose Gift they now are; together with the Names of the present Incumbents, and how long they have enjoyed their respective Benefices.

*Dresden, Nov. 19.* We are informed by Letters from divers Parts of this Electorate, that the Distemper has broke out again amongst the horned Cattle, and has carried off a great Number of them.

*Mayence, Nov. 20.* The Elector our Sovereign, who has passed great Part of the Summer at Alchaffenbourg and Hoffheim, came here on Thursday last. His Highness, in passing by Hochst, a small Town upon the Mayn, in the Neighbourhood of Frankfort, went to view the new Manufactory of China, which was lately set up there by his Order, and appeared extremely satisfied with the good Condition in which he found it, and with the great Progress they have made in that Manufacture.

*Frankfort, Nov. 21.* The Elector of Bavaria passed through this City last Saturday on his Way to Bon, in order to assist at the Celebration of the Feast of St. Clement, of which the Elector of Cologne, his Uncle, bears the Name. We learn from Cassel, that Prince Frederick Augustus of Holstein Gottorp, Bishop of Lubeck, arrived there on the 16th Instant from Hambourg, and that his Marriage with the eldest Daughter of Prince Maximilian of Hesse, was celebrated on the 21st, with great Magnificence, in the Castle of Ameliensthal.

*Berlin, Nov. 22.* The King has conferred on M. d'Osterwick, an Officer in the Regiment of Foot of Hautcharmoy, the Title of Counsellor of War and Domains of the Chamber of Cleves. We are informed by our last Letters from Breslau, that M. Munchow, Major of the Regiment of Foot of Lestewitz, now in Garrison in that City, died there a few Days ago, of an Apoplectick Fit, in the 53d Year of his Age. We are likewise informed, by Letters from Spandau, that one Ann Jostin died lately in the Neighbourhood of that Place, aged 107 Years and some Months.

*Paris, Nov. 24.* Yesterday the King set out from Versailles for Choisy, but proposes to return thither again on Saturday next, in order to assist at a grand Council of Dispatches which is to be held there that Day. His Majesty has conferred the Government of the Island of St. Domingo, vacant by the Death of Commodore Du Bois de la Mothe, on M. de Vaudreuil; and has appointed M. de Kerleret to succeed M. Vaudreuil in the Post of Governor of the Mississippi.

*Hague, Nov. 28.* Her Royal Highness the Princess Governante has been pleased to approve of the Nomination of Magistrates of this Place for the Year ensuing. This Morning the States of Holland and Westfrizeland reassumed their Deliberations. Their High Mightinesses have received Letters from Surinam, dated the 11th of September last, with an Account, that Major General Baron Sporcke, Governor, per interim, of that Colony, died there on the 7th of that Month, of an Apoplectick Fit.
