Petersbourg, December 5.

LAST Sunday Night the Frost set in so very severe, that all Navigation upon the River Neva is already stopt by the great Quantity of Ice which is now floating on it. We are assured that the Empress's Departure for Moscow will take Place as soon as a sufficient Quantity of Snow is fallen to make the Ways passable for Sledges, for which Purpose the Troops who are to escort her Imperial Majesty in that Journey, have received Orders to hold themselves in Readiness to march upon the first Notice.

Modena, Dec. 11. The Treaty of Commerce, which has been for some Time negotiating between his Sardinian Majesty and the Duke our Sovereign, was concluded at Turin on the 24th past, and proves very advantagious to the Subjects of both Courts.

Hanover, Dec. 16. The Distemper amongst the horned Cattle continuing to make great Havock in several Places in the Neighbourhood of this City, the Government is taking all possible Precautions to prevent its spreading farther into the Country.

Vienna, Dec. 16. We are assured that her Imperial Majesty intends to make a great Promotion of General Officers on New Year's Day, when the important Post of Grand Master of the Household, vacant by the Death of Field Marshal Count Konigsfegg, will be disposed of. 'Tis said that Count Pallavicini will soon lay down his Employment of Governor of the Dutchy of Milan, and that he will be succeeded therein by Count Caunitz Rittberg. On the 6th Instant a Fire broke out in the Spanish Hospital, which down the greatest Part of that large Edifice. And this Morning a Fire broke out in one of our Magazines, by the blowing up of which, and the bursting of some Bombs that were charged, several Persons were killed and wounded, and many Houses adjoining were greatly damaged.

Dresden, Dec. 18. Their Polish Majesties, who set out from Warsaw the 11th Instant, accompanied by the Princes Xavier and Charles, arrived here on Saturday Night last in perfect Health, having rested the preceding Night at the Seat of Count Bruhl at Pforten; since which most of the Foreign Ministers, who attended the Court, are also arrived from Warsaw. The Princess Royal, who a few Days ago was pretty much indisposed, is now much better. We learn by an Express from Weymar; that the Princess Guillelmina Augusta, eldest Daughter of the late Prince Ernest Augustus of Saxe Weymar, died there on the 8th Instant, after a tedious Illness, in the 36th Year of her Age.

Brussels, Dec. 18. On Tuesday last, being the Birth Day of Prince Charles of Lorraine, our Governor General, who then entred into the 41st Year of his Age, the same was celebrated with great Magnificence, all the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, appearing at Court in their richest Habits, to compliment his Serene Highness on that Occasion.

Manheim, Dec. 20. Last Monday Morning the Elector of Bavaria set out from hence on his Return to Munich.

Berlin, Dec. 20. The Diversions of the present Carnival are very brilliant, not only on Account of the several Foreign Nobility who are arrived here to partake of them, but also by the King's honouring them with his Presence. M. Mylius, Counsellor of War and Justice, having obtained Leave to resign his Employment of Auditor General, with the Allowance of a considerable Pension, his Majesty has conferred the same on M. Pawlowsky. The Sugar Refiners established in this Country, having met with great Encouragement, several private Persons are going to set up that Art. In the Night between the 14th and 15th Instant, we had as violent a Storm of Wind as has been known for a long Time past, by which the Inhabitants of this City have suffered very much. We have received

received an Account, that Prince Frederick Adolphus of Mecklenbourg-Strelitz, died at Strelitz, on the 11th Instant, of an Apoplectick Fit, in the 67th Year of his Age; and dying without Issue, the Succession to the Dutchies of Mecklenbourg and Strelitz, devolves on the young Duke of Mecklenbourg-Mirow, who is but 15 Years of Age.

Hague, Dec. 26. The Repairs that have been making in some of the Apartments at Court being finished, it is expected her Royal Highness the Princess Governante will soon leave the House in the Wood, and come to reside here for the Winter. 'Tis said the State of War for the Year 1753, will be carried this Week to the Assembly of their High Mightinesses. This Afternoon her Royal Highness the Princess Governante took her Seat for the first Time in the Council of State, without any Ceremony; from whence she repaired to the College of the Committee of Council of Holland and Westfrizeland, and having taken her Place, and heard some Debates, she went to the Assembly of our Lords the States of this Province, to whom she made a short Speech; and lastly her Royal Highness repaired to the Assembly of the States General, where she likewise took her Seat, and assisted for some Time at their Deliberations. Her Royal Highness was conducted to the several Colleges by the Baron de Burmania, Grand Marshal of the Court, General Grovestines, Master of the Horse, and the Baron de Voight, Chamberlain of the Household. A Plan for the Reform of our Troops was laid before the Assembly of the States General, by Order of the Princess Governante, the same Day, and met with their Approbation, by which a Reduction of 42 Men is to be made in the Body Guards, 224 in the Foot Guards, and 352 in the Swiss Guards. The States General have received Advice from Captain Hoogstraten, Commander of the Raven Man of War, that the said Captain sailed from Gibraltar on the 18th of last Month, and arrived the next Day at Tetuan, where he was received with great Marks of Distinction; and after some Conferences with the Deputies of the Emperor of Morocco, a Treaty of Peace and Friendship was agreed on between the Emperor their Master and the States General, which was to be signed the 21st of that Month. And that he had likewise, by the said Treaty, agreed for the Redemption of Captain Steenis, and the other Dutch Slaves, who were accordingly all sent on board his Ship.
