Lisbon, November 18.

THE Farmers of Tobacco have renewed their Contract with the King for three Years, on Condition of their paying to his Majefty the yearly Sum of two Millions and eighty Thoufand Cruzades, befides the accuftomed Duties. The King, in Imitation of the King of Spain, is determined to put his Marine on a refpectable Footing, for which Purpofe his Majefty has engaged two experienced Englifh Sbipbuilders, who have agreed to build 18 Men of War and Frigats in the Courfe of two Years, on Condition they have the Liberty of chufing fuch Ports as they fhall think moft convenient to build them in. The Court is ftill at Bellem, from whence their Majefties generally come once a Week to partake of the Winter Diverfions that are carrying on in this City.

- Leghorn, Nov. 30. The Mafters of feveral Shipe arrived here within this Week paft affure us, that there are at prefent no Barbary Corfairs on our Coaft. We learn by our laft Letters from Corfica, that the Malecontents of that Inand continue very mutinous, and feem on the Brink of committing Hoftilities againft fuch of the Inhabitants who take Part with the Genoefe.

Rome, Dec. 2. Prince Efterhafi, late Ambaffiador from their Imperial Majefties to the King of the Two Sicilies, who arriwed here from Naples on Friday laft with his Spoufe, was the next Day prefented to the Pope, and received with great Marks of Diftinction; he propofes to flay here about eight Days, and then to continue his Journey for Vienna. The ${ }^{2}$ Congregation de Propaganda Fide were lately informed by Letters from China, that the Emperor of that Country, having conceived more favourable Sentiments of the Chriftians fettled in his Dominions than heretofore, hid at length permitted the Miffionaries to continue their Functions as before their late Perfecution ; which News is the more agreeable, as by fome former Advices it was greatly feared thofe Miffionaries
muft have quitted that Country, and retired into Europe.

Turin, Dec, 3. The Beginning of laft Week the Court came, here from the Palace of the Venerie for the Winter. They go on very fuccefsfully in raifing Men for the two Regiments of Foot with which the King has refolved to augment his Forces ; and 'tis not doubted but thofe two Regiments will be compleated by the Spring.

Cadiz, Dec. 4. His Britannick Majefty's Ship the Dolphin, Capt. How, failed from hence on the ad Inftant; and the Lime, Capt, Proby, who arrived here the 23 d paft, propofes failing for England in about three Weeks.

Naples, Dec. 5.' The King fet out on Friday laft for Perfano, a Hunting-Seat about 40 Miles diftant from hence, where his Majefty propofes to continue till the 20th Inftant. Prince Corfini, Nephew to Pope Clement XII. died here on the 3oth of laft Month, immenfely rich. He was Counfellor of State to the King, and formerly Viceroy of Sicily. The Men of War, Galleys, and Shebecques are all return'd into Port, from their refpéctive Cruizes, for the Winter.

Petersbourg, $\mathcal{D}_{e c}$. 5. Laft Week a grand Conference was held at Count Beftucheff's, Great. Chancellor of this.Empire, at which General Baron Pretlack, Ambaffador from their Imperial Majefties, affifted ; as did alfo M. Funch, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland; 'tis faid this Conference turned upon Affairs of great Confequence; which is the readier believed, as Couriers were, immediately after its breaking up, difpatched to Conftantinople, .Vienna, and Drefden. Her Imperial Majefty has appointed M. Sperat, Affeffor of the College of Commerce of this City, to be Director of that of Archangel. M. de Malzhan, the Danih Envoy Extraordinary, has informed this.
