Manich, Dec. 23. The Elector our Sovereign returned here Yesterday from his late Tour to the Courts of Bonn, Leige and Manheim; and this Morning his Electoral Highness was complemented thereupon by the Nobility, and other f Persons of Distinction.

Hahover, Dec. 25. The Diftemper amongst the Horned Cattle, which of late has raged pretty much in feveral Villages in this Neighbourhood, is greatly abated within this Fortnight past; and, as the utmost Care is taken to prevent its foreading farther into the Country, we hope the worft is over.

Paris, Dec. 26. On the 17th Instant, the Archbishop of this City, affisted by the Bishops of Blois and Viviers, performed the Ceremony of confecrating the new Bishop of Caftres in the Royal Chapel at the Palace ; and the next Day that Prelate waited on the King at Verfailles, and took the usual Oaths of Fidelity to his Majesty. They write from Franche-Comte, that on the 10th Inftant a Fire broke out at Orgelet, which burnt with fuch Violence, that the greatest Part of the Houses of that Town are entirely reduced to Ashes, Cologn, Dec. 28, A notorious Villain lately apprehended here, having upon his Examination confessed a Defign of his Comrades to break open the Treasury of the Metropolitan Church of this City, they have fince placed Centinels near the fame every Night to guard it. They write from Rome, that the Pope intends shortly to make a Promotion of four Cardinals. Paris, Jan. 3. On Monday last their most Christian Majesties and all the Royal Family received at Verfailles the Ceremony of all the Foreign Ministers, paying in a Body the Compliments on the New Year. The fame Day M. de Hautefort, the late French Ambassador at the Court of Vienna, was installed in the Order of the Holy Ghoft; and his most Christian Majefty named the following Six new Knights: The Duc de Fleury, one of the Gentlemen of his Majesty's Bed-Chamber; the Marquess de L'Hopital, first Gentleman of the Horse of Madam Adelaide; Le Comte de la Vauguyon, **A** Lieutenant General; the Marquess de Cruffol, Major-General and Minister from this Court to that of Parma; M. Ceres de Brancas, a General Officer; and M. d'Armentieres, a Lieutenant General. Count Kaunitz left Paris the fame Day at Three o'Clock in the Afternoon, on his Réturn to Vienna, taking his Route thro' Bruffels, where he will make fome Stay. M. de Marechal is to remain here, till the Arrival of another Minister from that Court.

Mayor, Recorder, Bayliffs, Aldermen, Burgeffes and Commons of the Town of Youghall r and of the Merchants, Traders and Citizens of the City of Dublin, to his Majesty, upon his fafe Return to his British Dominions; the King was pleafed to receive the fame very gra-g cioufly.
