E are informed by our laft Advices from Moscow, that Count Rasoumoffky, Attaman or Chief of the Coffacks, was arrived there from the Ukraine; and that he had been introduced to the Empress, and met with a gracious Reception, her Imperial Majefty expressing the highest Satisfaction at the Account he gave of the Affairs of that Province. Count Bestucheff, the Great Chancellor, is still fo weak, that there is no Appearance of his being foon able to follow the Empress; but Baron Pretlack, Am-'baffador from Vienna, is greatly recovered, and propoles fhortly to fet out for Molcow; for , which Journey he is already making Preparations.

Stockholm, Feb. 4. The Court is still at Ulrichídahl, from whence the King comes frequently to affift at the Deliberations of the Senate. The College of Commerce has published an Ordonnance, by his Majesty's express Order, commanding all Captains or Mafters of Swedish Ships whatfoever, who shall happen to fall in with the three Dutch Ships which were last Year obliged to be left amongst the Ice on the Coast of Greenland, not to fuffer any of their Crews to take the least Thing out of them; but, on the Contrary, to do all in their Power to fecure them for the Use of the Owners. Copenhagen, Feb. 9. The King, who fome Days ago was pretty much indifposed, is now perfectly recovered, and goes frequently a Hunting in the Neighbourhood of Jagersbourg. The Chamberlain Count Cheusses, whom his Majefty has named to replace the late Count Dehn in the Poft of Envoy Extraordinary and Minister, Plenipotentiary to the States General of the United Provinces, is arrived here from his Country Seat in Holftein, in order to receive his Instructions before he repairs to the Hague. Count Cobentzel, whom their Imperial Majesties named some Time ago to affift, in Quality of their Commission, at the Election that is fhortly to be made of a new Prince-Archbishop of Saltzbourg, set out from hence on Sunday laft for Saltzbourg; and Count Pergen, who came here lately to compliment the Elector our Sovereign upon the Re-eftablishment of his Health, is appointed to take Care of the Affairs of the Court of Vienna in his Abfence. Paris, Feb. 14. Since the Beginning of this Month feveral Couriers have arrived here from Stockholm and Berlin, whose Dispatches have occasioned the holding of divers Councils.
