Moseow, April 4.

EVERAL Couriers are arrived here from Constantinople, Vienna, and London, within these few Days; and tho' the Great Chancellor, Count Bestucheff, is not perfectly recovered of his late Illness, yet he has constantly assisted at the Councils that have been held upon the Arrival of the Dispaches brought by those Couriers. On Wednesday last her Imperial Majesty, accompanied by the Great Duke and Great Dutchess, and attended by several Lords and Ladies of the Court, honoured her Great Huntsman, Count Rasomdsky, with her Presence at Dinner, at his Country Seat about five Wersts from this City.

Leghorn, April 9. They write from Genoa, that the Inhabitants of several Villages in the Neighbourhood of that City have taken up Arms, and absolutely refuse to pay any longer the heavy Taxes with which they are charged; and that the Government were thereupon taking proper Measures, in order, if possible, to bring them to a Compliance with the Laws of their Country, and to make them more dutiful Sub-

jects for the Future.

Rome, April 14. The Duke and Dutchess of Wirtembourg, who went on a Tour to Naples, are expected back To-morrow, in order to affist at the Ceremonies used here in Passion-Week. The Hereditary Prince of Anspach is perfectly recovered, but as yet no Day is fixed for his leaving this City. They write from Venice, that upon Advice received there, that the Turks were in Motion in Dalmatia, the Government have dispatched Orders to the Governors and Commandants of all the fortified Places belonging to the Republick, to keep constantly on their Guard, in order to prevent any Surprize.

Montpellier, April 14. The Marquess de Cursay, heretofore Commander of the French Troops in Corfica, is still here, but 'tis thought | he will shortly obtain Leave to return to Paris, in order to justify himself from the several Ac-

sulations laid to his Charge.

Stockholm, April 18. The King's Ague and Fever continues, but the Queen is perfectly recovered, and advances happily in her Pregnancy. The Baron de Fuchs, Governor of this City, and the Countess de Hoorn, Spouse to the Grand Marshal of the Court, both died last Week in

this City.

Vienna, April 18. Last Saturday the Emperor was feized with a shivering Fit, which being followed with a flight Fever, he was blooded by Way of Precaution, and is still confined to his Apartment. On Monday a Council of State was held on some Dispatches received from London, at which the Empress affisted in Person. The same Day Prince Esterhasi, late Ambassador from this Court to that of Naples, arrived here from Italy, and Yesterday he was introduced to her Imperial Majesty, and met with a gracious Reception. They are hard at Work in getting ready the late Prince Eugene's Apartments for the Residence of the Archduke Joseph and his future Spouse, and 'tis reckoned they will be finished by the End of next Month.

Liege, April 22. The Prince Cardinal, our Bishop, having declared his Intention of removing on Tuesday next to the Castle of Seraing for the Summer, they are making the necessary Preparations at that Palace for his Reception.

Hambourg, April 24. We have just received Advice, that the greatest Part of the Town of Jaffy, Capital of Moldavia, is reduced to Ashes by a Fire that lately broke out there, and continued burning for 24 Hours, during which the Palace of the Hospodar, several Roman Catholick Churches, the Lutheran Church, the Greek Church, and several other publick Buildings, were entirely consumed; the Flames spreading so fast, that even the yearly Contributions of the Inhabitants to the Grand Signior, which were lodged in the Hospodar's Palace, and which amounted to a confiderable Sum, could not possibly be saved.

Berlin, April 24. The King has conferred the Regiment of Cuirassiers of the late Major General Stille, on Major General Baron Schonaich; and Baron Schonaich's Regiment of

Dragoons.
