

between Count Palaftrelli, Aid-Major of the Regiment of Italian Guards, and Captain Pignatelli, of the same Regiment, in which the former loft his Life; and the King having been informed that the Captain was the Aggressor, has ordered him to be arrested and brought to Tryal. On the 26th past, the Right Honourable, the Earl of Rochford, his Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of Turin, arrived here with his Lady; since which he has been admitted to an Audience of their Majesties at Portici, by the Marquess Fogliani, Prime Minister and Secretary of State, and was most graciously received. His Lordship proposes to stay here a few Days longer, in order to see every Thing remarkable in this City, and then to set out for Florence, and from thence to Venice, which he proposes to reach by the End of this Month, in order to partake of the Festival of the Ascension.

Florence, May 11. On the 2d Instant the Hereditary Prince of Anspach, after seeing the Curiosities of this Place, set out from hence for Bologna. On the 7th there was an Assembly of the Knights of the Order of St. Stephen, both secular and Ecclesiasticks, when the Emperor's Pleasure was signified to them, that for the Future they should wear the Habit of the Order in all publick Functions. On the 8th a Battallion of the Lorraine Regiment of Foot Guards arrived here from Leghorn. We are informed by our last Advices from Toulon, that four French Gallies are already equipped in that Port, to embark her Royal Highness the Dutches of Parma, on her Return to Lombardy.

Leghorn, May 12. The last Advices received here from Corsica inform us, that the Chiefs of the Malecontents of that Island have secured five Persons who were deputed to wait on them with some Overtures for an Accommodation with the Genoese.

Rome, May 14. The Departure of the Court for Castel-Gandolfo, is fixed for the 1st of next Month. The Abbe Count Clati, agreeable to the Commissions he has received from the Pope, is preparing to set out for Germany, to carry the new Prince of Saltzbourg, the Archepiscopal Pallum, which the See of Rome sends to every new elected Archbishop of that Principality. On the 1st Instant, M. de Calignac had an Audience of Leave of the Pope, and on Saturday last he set out on his Return to France. We learn from Forli, a Town in the Romagna, that a violent Shock of an Earthquake was lately felt there, and in that Neighbourhood, but that the same happily went off without doing any considerable Damage.

Stockholm, May 17. On Monday last, being the King's Birth-day, who then entred into the 44th Year of his Age, the same was celebrated at Court with great Solemnity. His Majesty has ordered the Garrisons in Swedish Pomerania to be augmented with about 1200 Men. Two Battallions are ordered to be transported to Finland, in order to be employed at the Fortifications.

Vienna, May 19. Their Imperial Majesties Departure for the Camp at Kitsee in Hungary, remains fixt for the 4th of next Month; after which they propose going to review the Body of Artillery that is to be drawn together for that Purpose at Teyn upon the Moldau.

Copenhagen, May 21. The Directors of our East-India Company have received Advice, that one of their Ships, named the Princess Wilhelmine-Caroline, arrived safe at the Cape of Good Hope on the 28th of January last; and that some Days after two of our Men of War, named the Nettelblad and Bornholm, also arrived there from Tranquebar; so that an Account of their Arrival in some of the Ports of this Kingdom, is shortly expected.

Hambourg, May 25. The Deputies, whom the Regency of this City sent to Vienna, to thank their Imperial Majesties for their good Offices in procuring the Re-establishment of our Commerce with Spain, are expected back this Week. The Chamberlain Count Cheusses, the new Danish Minister Plenipotentiary to the States General, arrived here last Night, and this Morning continued his Journey for the Hague.

Brussels, May 26. This Morning Prince Charles of Lorraine, our Governour General, set out from hence with a numerous Retinue for Vienna. The same Day the Prince of Tour Taxis, the Emperor's principal Commissary to the Diet of Ratisbon, arrived here with the Princess his Spouse.

Cologn, May 28. Last Saturday. Prince Charles of Lorraine arrived here about Six in the Afternoon, and was saluted at his Entrance by a general Discharge of the Artillery upon our Ramparts; and having changed Relays, his Highness continued his Route for Warth, where he intended to lay that Night: Yesterday 'twas expected he would reach Dettingen, and this Night Langenfeld, from whence he proposed to reach Schonbron in three Days and an half.

Hague, May 31. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland, who assembled Yesterday, have this Morning continued their Deliberations. Baron d'Aylva, lately appointed one of the Deputies to the Assembly of the States General, on the Part of the Province of Frizeland, has taken his Seat in that Assembly, having been introduced by Baron Burmania. Count Cheusses, who is coming hither to replace the late Count Dehn as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Denmark, is expected here some Day next Week, the necessary Passports for his Equipage having been already sent away.
