Lisbon, May 4.

THE new Governor of Maranham, Brother to Don Carvalho-y-Melo, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, having obtained an Order for the Artillery and Ammunition he has been for some Time soliciting, to compleat that Settlement, the same is now actually putting on board the Transports bound for that Place. The King has also granted him a small Body of Troops, who are preparing to embark on board the two Frigats lately launched here; which Frigats are appointed to convoy the Fleet, and the whole will put to Sea with the first fair Wind.

Cronstadt, May 13. On the 6th Instant, being the Anniversary of her Imperial Majesty's Coronation, the same was celebrated with great Magnificence by Vice Admiral Polansky, Governor of this Place. In the Morning the Artillery upon the Ramparts were fired, and were answered by those of all the Ships at Anchor in this Port: At Noon the Governor, attended by all the Officers of the Garrison, and those belonging to the Ships, went in Procession to Church, and heard Te Deum sung to Musick, during which there was a triple Discharge of the Cannon upon the Ramparts. After which all the Officers and Gentry were elegantly entertained at Dinner by the Governor. At Night he gave a Ball for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and there were Illuminations and Bonfires throughout the Town.

Naples, May 15. Yesterday the four Gallies which carried the Regiment of Foot of Royal Bourbon to Palermo, returned into Port, having suffered very much in a violent Tempest, in which they had all liked to have perished. The Algerine Chebeck, lately taken off Cape Spartivento, by those of the King, has been conducted, by his Majesty's express Order, to Messina, where she is now actually performing Quarantine.

Florence, May 18. On the 11th Instant the Duke and Duchess of Wirtemberg arrived here from Rome with a numerous Retinue; and hav-

ing spent three or four Days in viewing the Curiosities of this Place, set out on Wednesday last on their Journey to Leghorn, Pisa, and Massa, in order to embark at Lerice for Genoa.

Rome, May 19. The Marquess de Mayo, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of the Two Sicilies to the Imperial Court, arrived here on Sunday Night last from Naples; the next Day he was presented to the Pope, and was received with great Distinction, and Yesterday he continued his Route for Vienna. The Plan that was presented to the Pope, for erecting some Works near Fiumicino, in order to check the Current of the Waters of the Tyber, when that River happens to overflow its Banks, has been approved, and those Works will be immediately set about.

Genoa, May 20. We hear that Affairs in the Island of Corsica are arrived to such a Crisis, that the Marquess de Grimaldi, the Republic's Commissary General in that Island, has desired Leave to resign his Employment.

Leghorn, May 21. We are informed by the Master of a Ship just arrived in this Port from the Coast of Sicily, that two Neapolitan Men of War, cruizing off Cape Passaro, have fallen in with, and taken, a large Corsair of 36 Guns, and 300 Men, after an obstinate Engagement; which Corsair proved afterwards to be the Man of War the Algerines took last Year from the Venetians. They write from the Romagna, that notwithstanding the Inhabitants of several Districts in that Country have of late been frequently alarmed and frightened by terrible Shocks of an Earthquake, we do not at present hear that they have received any considerable Damage. The Report of a Body of Troops being ordered into this Country, to reinforce those already here, is now confirmed, three Imperial Regiments of Foot being actually on their March hither.

Stockholm, May 27. Prince Gustavus continues still out of Order with an Ague and Fever, all the Medicines he has hitherto taken, to carry it off, having proved unsuccessful. The King has been pleased to appoint M. Arnel, Member of the College of the Chancery, to succeed the late M. de Skutenhielm, in the Post of Secretary
