Lisbon, May 6.

THE King has disposed, in Favour of Don Joseph Bernard Malafaya de Castro-Pareira, of a Commanderie in the Order of Christ, which happened to be vacant by the Death of Don Louis-Manuel de Castanheda y Moura Telles. 'Tis more and more confirmed, that the Fleet for Rio de Janeiro will sail thither without any Delay.

Madrid, May 22. For several Days past we have had publick Prayers here, on Account of the Drought which has of late afflicted this Kingdom, and still continues. The King has appointed the Lieutenant-General Marquess de Cayro to be Captain General of the Province of Majorca, and has continued Don Joseph de Quevedo in the Government of Xeres in Andalusia: Don Ignatio de Areyzaga, Captain in the Grenada Regiment of Foot, has been appointed to the Command of the Second Battalion in that of Burgos; and Captain Andre Lindemaim to that of the Majority of the Swiss Regiment of Bush. Several other Civil and Military Employments have also been lately disposed of.

Bologna, May 29. The Chevalier Majo, the Neapolitan Envoy to the Imperial Court, has passed through this Place on his Way to Vienna, accompanied by the Duke of Spezzano and the Marquiss Carassi.

Toulouse, May 30. The Remonstrances made to the King by the Parliament of this Place in July last, having been made the Subject of two Pamphlets, the one entitled, The Remarks of a Bishop in the Province of Languedoc, on the Parliament of Toulouse's Remonstrances of the 17th of July 1752; and the other, Remarks on an Arret of the same Parliament of August 17, 1752, the Parliament has thought proper to issue an Arret, whereby the said Papers are deemed infamous, and ordered to be burnt by the Common Hangman, in the Yard of their Palace.

Vienna, June 2. The Duke Charles of Lorraine, Governor General of the Austrian Netherlands, arrived here last Night from Brussels, and was received by their Imperial Majesties, and the Princess Charlotte of Lorraine his Sister, with all the Tokens of inexpressible Joy and Tenderness. Count Harrach, who is lately returned from Madrid, will receive his Instructions without

any Delay, in order to set out immediately in his Quality of Minister Plenipotentiary from our Court to that of Turin. Count Cobentzel, who is nominated in the same Quality, with respect to the Government of the Austrian Netherlands, is set out for Brussels.

Copenhagen, June 4. The King has been pleased to make some Military Promotions, by which, amongst others, Prince Charles Ernett of Holstein Glucksburg has been raised to the Rank of Major General of Foot. The Queen advances very happily in her Pregnancy. Seventeen Men of the Crew of the Princess Royal of Denmark, which was wrecked last Year near the Cape of Good Hope, are returned hither in another Ship lately arrived here, with a great Quantity of Goods.

Aranjuez, June 4. Wednesday the 30th of last Month, being the King's Name-day, the same was celebrated at Court with the usual Magnificence. In the Morning their Majesties received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers; after which the Marquis de la Ensenada gave a grand Entertainment to above 40 Persons; and at Night a Serenata was performed before their Majesties in the new Theatre, lately built in the Palace. The Gardens could not be illuminated, as was intended, on Account of its raining the whole Evening, but the Illuminations, which were designed for that Day, will be made, if the Weather permits, on Wednesday next, which is the King of Portugal's Birth-day. A great Quantity of Rain has fallen here for this Week past, but the Season is too far advanced for it to be of much Service to the Harvest.

Hague, June 4. The States of Holland and Westfriseland have assembled this Morning for the first Time since their last Session. The Corpse of the late Field Marshal Count Nassau, was carried last Night, in a Hearse with six Horses, attended by six Coaches, to Delft, whence it is to be transported in a Yacht to Ouwkerk, to be deposited there in the Vault of that Family.

Turin, June 9. M. Gobbi, the new Venetian Resident, had last Week his Audiences, and delivered his Credential Letters in the usual Forms; and M. Colombo had, at the same Time, his Audiences of Leave, and has received the usual Present of his Sardinian Majesty's Picture set with Diamonds.
