WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made in the eighth  
 Year of the Reign of his present Majesty King George  
 the Second, entituled, An Act for the Amendment of the Law  
 relating to Actions on the Statute of Hue and Cry, it is enacted,  
 That no Person shall have or maintain any Action against any  
 Hundred, unless he or she shall, within the Space of twenty  
 Days next after the Robbery committed, cause publick Notice  
 to be given thereof in the London Gazette: In Pursuance where-  
 of Dorothy Pomroy, of Lifton in the County of Devon, Widow,  
 hereby gives Notice, That on Tuesday the Tenth Day of July  
 Instant, about the Hour of Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon  
 of the same Day, she was assaulted and stopped in the King's  
 Highway, near a Place called Heath-Cross, in the Parish of

 half Guineas, and four Moydores, amounting in the whole to  
 the Sum of thirty-five Pounds.
