HEREAS His Majerty hath received Information, that great Numbers of ill disposed and disorderly Perfons, dwelling in or near the Forest of Kingswood in the County of Gloucester, did, on Monday the Twenty First, and on Friday the Twenty Fifth Days of May last, in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner affemble themfelves near to the City of Briftol, and armed with Clubs, Pitchforks, and other offenfive Weapons, and with a Drum beating before them, did, on both the faid Days, proceed to the faid City, and did there commit many great and enormous Outrages, in open Defiance of all Law, and to the Terror of His Majesty's good Subjects—And whereas it appears by Informations taken on Oath, and this Day laid before His Majesty in Council, That Sampson Phips, Samuel Britten, John Woody otherwife Wordy, and John Summers, Coalminers, and also Hezekiah Hunt, Cordwainer, were very active in one or both of the faid Riots, and were principal Leaders therein ; which faid Sampson Phips, Samuel Britten, John Woody otherwise Wordy, John Summers, and Hezekiah Hunt, are fled from Juffice : To the End therefore that the faid Offenders, and every of them, may be brought to condign Punishment—His Majesty is pleased to order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds shall be paid to fuch Person or Perfons as fhall difcover and apprehend, or caufe to be difcovered and apprehended, the faid Sampson Phips, so as he may be convicted of the faid Offence; and that the Sum of One Hundred Pounds schall in like Manner be paid to fuch Person or Persons as shall discover and apprehend, or caufe to be difcovered and apprehended, either of them the faid Samuel Britten, John Woody otherwife Wordy, John Summers, and Hezekiah Hunt, fo as they, or

and all His loving Subjects, that they do use their utmost Diligence, by all lawful Ways and Means, in and about the apprehending the said Offenders and every of them.

Algiers; June 15: Though the Plague continues to make a great Havock amongst the Inhabitants of this Place, it don't lessen in the least the Activity of the Corfairs, who are actually equipping feveral Chebecks; and other Warlike Vessels, to carry on their Piracies.

Constantinople, June 16, The Porte is very vigilant to prevent any interior Disorders. We have had no Fires of late. The Heads of several Highwaymen have been brought hither from Asia.

Moscow; June 28. The Empress is again returned to the Country, where her Imperial Majesty intends to stay a Fortnight or three Weeks. The Troops that are to form a Camp on the Frontiers of Livonia, by her Imperial Majesty's Orders, are already drawn together at their general Rendezvous, 2 or 3000 Huss, and 8000 Donith Cossacks, only excepted.

Madrid, July 5. The King has been pleafed to grant the Place of Corrigidor of the City of Benabarra, to Don Angelo de Figueroa. His Majesty has given Orders to built a Fort at Jonquiera, in the Province of Catalonia, fimilar to that which is building at Figuiera, for the greater Security of that Province. Two eminent Phyficians are fet out from hence for St. Ildefonía, on account of the Queen Dowager being indifposed at that Place. Naples, July 5. We hear from Civitella, in the ulterior Abbruzzo, that at the latter End of last Month, they had felt, for several Days together, at the Rifing and Setting .of the Sun, very strong Earthquakes, some Shocks of which had
