Modena, Aug. 10. The Duke our Sovereign has been at Maffa fince the 3d Inftant, from whence his Serene Highnels is expected to return to Saffuolo next Tuesday. It is affured that the hereditary Prince will foon fet out for Vienna, in order to receive, from the Emperor's own Hands, the Order of the Golden Fleece.

Dresden, Aug. 12. Their Majesties, with the Princes Xavier and Charles, returned hither the Day before Yesterday from Sedlitz in perfect Health. The Count de Bellegard, the King's Minister at the Court of Turin, is daily expected here on his Return from that Court. Hague, Aug. 23.
