A PROCLAMÁTION.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-seventh Day of this Instant September; We, with the Advice of Privy Council, do hereby Publish and Dedre, That the said Parliament shall be surther progued on the said Twenty-seventh Day of homeber, to Thursday the Fisteenth Day of homeber next: And we have given Order to be Chancellor of Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And we do hereby surther Declare our loval Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Fisteenth Day of November next, be held, and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Linghts, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Fisteenth Day of November next.

Given at our Court at Kensington the Twenty-fixth Day of September 1753, in the Twenty-seventh Year of our Reign.

Advocate, one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace of the County of Edinburgh in Scotland, with having been guilty, upon the Eighth Day of the faid Month of July, of being, together with diverse other Persons, affembled at Dalgety in the County of Fife; and there having fur-rounded four Soldiers who were employed to defend a Seizure, made by a Custom-house Officer, of Twenty-nine Anchors of Run Brandy, wrest-ed and took from them their Arms, and deforced the faid Custom-house Officer, and took away the Brandy.—Which Information was afterwards certified by the faid Archibald Murray, under his Hand and Seal, to one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the same before his Majesty in his Privy Council, pursuant to the late Act of Parliament of the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of his present Majefty in that Case made and provided .-His Majesty doth, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, by this his Order in his Privy Council, require and command, that the faid William Cuthbertson, William Steedman, William Baird, Adam Lillie, James Manson, James Lillie, and William Lennox, and each of them, do furrender himself and themselves, within the Space of Forty Days after the first Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to any of the Lords of Justiciary, or to any one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace in Scotland.
