WHEREAS William Cuthbertson, William Steedman, William Baird, Adam Lillie, James Manson, James Lillie, and William Lennox, all Boatmen at *Aberdour*, were upon the Twenty-third Day of July last charged by Information of a credible Person upon Oath, by him subscribed before Mr. Archibald Murray, of Murrayfield, Advocate, one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace of the County of Edinburgh in Scotland, with having been guilty, upon the Eighth Day of the said Month of July, of being, together with diverse other Persons, assembled at *Dalgety* in the County of Fife; and there having surrounded four Soldiers who were employed to defend a Seizure, made by a Custom-house Officer, of Twenty-nine Anchors of Run Brandy, wrested and took from them their Arms, and deposed the said Custom-house Officer, and took away the Brandy.—Which Information was afterwards certified by the said Archibald Murray, under his Hand and Seal, to one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the same before his Majesty in his Privy Council, pursuant to the late Act of Parliament of the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of his present Majesty in that Case made and provided.—His Majesty doth, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, by this his Order in his Privy Council, require and command, that the said William Cuthbertson, William Steedman, William Baird, Adam Lillie, James Manson, James Lillie, and William Lennox, and each of them, do surrender himself and themselves, within the Space of Forty Days after the first Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to any of the Lords of Justiciary, or to any one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace in Scotland.

Naples, Sept. 1. The Marriage of the Prince of *Scalea* with the Princess of *Tarfea Spinelli*, was celebrated in this City with great Magnificence, as well as by the Vassals of their respective Fiefs in *Calabria*. A few Days ago the Prince *Pandolfini* came here expressly from *Sicily*, to complain to the King against a pretended Injustice from *M. Cavalcante*, his Majesty's Advocate General, and Councillor to the Vice-Roy; but the King having considered this Step as irregular, ordered the Prince to repair to *Sicily*, where he should find his Directions to the Vice-Roy to enquire into the Affair. On the 23d Instant their Majesties went to view the Royal Palace at *Caserta*; they dined there, and in the Evening returned to Town. The Duke of *Monteleone*, jun. after five Days Service in the King's Life Guards, as a Supernumerary Cadet, has been promoted by his Majesty to a Commission of Exempt in the said Corps, with the Rank of Colonel.

Naples, Sept. 6. The Queen advances happily in her Pregnancy, and is as well as can be expected. The King went again last Week to *Caserta*, to give Orders concerning the Building of the new Palace. It is said that the Prince *d'Arde*, heretofore Ambassador from our Court to that of France, will in a short Time have a considerable Employment conferred on him, and it is even said that it will be the Vice-Royalty of *Sicily*. By a Vessel lately arrived here from *Messina*, we are informed that a Galliot belonging to *Barbary*, having been driven by contrary Winds upon a Sand Bank, not far from *Palermo*, was cast away; and that 120 Men, of which the Crew consisted, having found Means to get on Shore, they were immediately attacked by the Fishermen, who made them all Slaves.

Rome, Sept. 1. It is expected that the Promotion of Cardinals will be published very soon, and the Pope, it is said, by the last French Courier, has caused Notice to be given to *M. Durini*, to take his Leave of that Court, on his Promotion to the Cardinal Dignity.
