Brussels, Oct. 1. On the 29th past Prince Charles of Lorrain arrived here, in perfect Health, from Vienna, and received thereupon the Compliments of the principal Nobility. His Highnels is preparing to set out for Marimont, to take the Diversion of Hunting.

Hague, Oct. 2. Baron Burmania, one of the Members of the Council of State for the Province of Friezland, fet out this Day for that Province. By the last Advices from Soeftdyk, their Royal and Serene Highness continued in perfect Health.

Hague, Oct. 4. Field Marshal Duke of Brunswick Wolfembuttle, who atrived here some Days ago from his Government of Boisle-Duc, set out on the 2d Instant for Soefidyk. According to the last Advices received from that Place, there is Room to believe the Court will not return from thence till the Celebration of the Anniversary of the Birth of her Royal Highness the Princess Governance.
