Ehemet Pascha, our former Vizir, chalyck but 25 Days : The Grand Signior has condescended to leave all his Estate and Effects to his Heirs. Abdulah Pascha, who is ordered from the Paschalyck of Cairo to Aleppo, is detained there by the usurped Power of Ibrahim Cheaia and others, who will not fuffer him to depart, until he reimburses 250,000 Dollars, which, they fay, he has taken from the Country without a just Claim. Petersbourg, Sept. 21. The 16th of this Month, being the Name-Day of the Empress, that Feast was celebrated with great Pomp and . Splendor. About Ten o'Clock in the Morning, the most diffinguished Persons in this City hawying affembled in rich Habits at the Palace of the Knees Gollitfin our Governor, they accompanied his Excellency to Divine Service, during which, three Discharges of Cannon were made from the Fortress and the Admiralty. This Nobleman afterwards returned Home with the fame brilliant Company, and gave a fumptuous Repart of many Tables : In the Evening the Front of his Houle, as allo those of the principal Houses in the City, were magnificently illuminated. It is faid that there will foon be feveral Military Promotions. The Count d'Apremont de Linden, who is appointed Commander in Chief of the Imperial Troops in Lombardy, is preparing to fet out for Milan. The Baron de Penckler, Minifter from this Court to the Ottoman Porte, has defired and obtain'd his Letters of Revocation, but he is to continue at Constantinople till the Arrival there of M. de Swackheim who is appointed his Succeffor. M. Serbelloni, who has resided here for several Years with the Character of Apostolick Nuncio, being to be included in the next Promotion of Cardinals, is preparing to fet out for Rome. Great Preparations are making at Schonbrun to celebrate there, next Thursday, the Feast of St. Francis, being the Emperor's Name Day. The Count de Colloredo, Vice-Chancellor of the Empire, is expected to arrive here this Day from Bohemia. Warfaw, Sept. 29. We learn from Grodno, that on the 21st of this Month a confiderable Fire happened there, by which the Convent of Ste, Brigitte, the Church of St. Esprit, the Hofpital adjoining thereto, about 200 private Houles, and 13 Houses of Persons of Distinction, have been entirely confumed.

Copenhagen, Oct. 1. The King has named M. Jacques Ployart to refide at Algiers in Quality of Conful of the Danish Nation. The Prefident Ogier, the new Minister Plenipotentiary from France to this Court, had on Monday Morning his first Audience of the King, to whom he delivered his Letters of Credence. The Abbe le Maire, whom the President Ogier replaces as French Minister at this Court, is preparing to set out for Paris, from whence, after having received his Instructions, he will repair

repair to Ratifbon, there to refide as his most Christian Majesty's Minister. The Queen of Defimark has felt fome Symptoms of her approaching Labour, which is now daily to be expected, the Term of her Majesty's Reckoning being expired.

Copenhagen, Oct. 6. Prince Ferdinand of Wolfembuttle is arrived here to vifit the Queen his Sifter, and proposes to flay hore the whole Month of November. His Highness lodges in the Palace, and has dined and hunted with the King, and is treated with great Kindness and Regard.

Egard. Genoa, Oct. 1. By the last Letters from Bastia, there is Advice of the Arrival there of four Deputies, on Behalf of the Malecontents, who were politely received by M. Grimaldi, the Re-, "publick's Commiffary Generaly afferting him of "the great Defire the People of the Island had to return to their Obedience under the Republick : They likewife preferced to M. Grimaldi a Lift of the Capitulations they demand, (which are the fame as those they gave to M, de Curlay) and he has transmitted them to this -Republick. M. Last Night General Pallavicini arrived at the Marquis Durazzo's House at Polcevera, efcorted by a Body of Huffars, where his Nuptials are to be celebrated. Milan, Oct. 1. They continue here to make great Preparations for the Reception of the Duke of Modena, who is expected for certain the End of this Month, to come and take the Character of Governor General of Auftrian Lombardy. Vienna, OS. 3. The Prince of Modena arrived here on Sunday Evening; but Monday being one of the Anniversaries of the late Emperor Charles XVII. on which the Empress Queen fees no Company, his Highnels' did not fee their Imperial Majesties till Yesterday in the Morning, when he had his Audiences of the Emperor and Empres, in the same Manner as the Ambaffadors of crowned Heads; and after they were over, and his Vifits to all the Royal Family, he had the Honour to dine with their Imperial Majeffies without Ceremony, and in

the Way that Perfons of Diffinction, as well Strangers as those of the Country, are daily admitted, In the Afternoon his Highnels made Visits to the two Chancellors, Counts Coloredo and Kaunitz.
