Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Coronation, the Great Guns were fired in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant upon this Occasion. At Night there was a Play given by his Grace for the Entertainment of the Ladies, and a Ball at the Castle. And this Day, being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in 1641, his Grace the Lord Lieutenant proceeded in the usual State to Christ-Church, attended by the House of Peers, Judges, &c. and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, where an excellent Sermon was preached by the Bishop of Down and Connor upon that Occasion. The Sword of State was carried to and from the Church by the Lord Knapton. After his Grace's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys of Small Arms from the Regiments of Foot on Duty, drawn out at the Royal Square at the Barracks. And the Evening concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
